Many people think that the staff, or the parents or the governors are the key stakeholders in a school; they all have their part to play and only by working in partnership can we have a successful school community. But I have a clear commitment to a personal vision, shared by the staff - it is the children who are at the heart of the school and I have been thinking about legacy in terms of the hundreds of children I have known and worked with.

Many wonderful, wonderful things come to mind, and here are a few highlights: our school values underpinning everything we do, Forest School and Outdoor Learning, Residential Trips (starting with Year 2 at Hill End!), a creative and thematic curriculum providing the children with many exciting learning opportunities, every child being involved in performance on the stage every year (from Nativity to Romeo and Juliet) and a whole school focus on personal development (independence, resilience, collaboration, responsibility). I am sure that these highlights will also be shared by the 280 children currently in school, but will also bring back memories to the many, many more young people who attended the school and are still living in Chilton.

Thank you for making me part of your community. I look forward to hearing about the next chapter for Chilton School, and send my very best wishes to you all.
