A Tribute to the Late Brian Morris from the VHMC

As many of you are aware the Village lost a highly regarded member of our community, Brian Morris, 10 months ago. Brian was a key component of the Chilton Village Hall Management Committee. His formal role was "Parish Council Representative/ Secretary", however in reality Brian was also, project coordinator, maintenance overseer, compliance officer and most importantly the person who kept the Committee on task. His impact on the Village is best represented by two of the bigger projects he oversaw, the building of the Community Room and the extension of the Village Hall. The Village Hall extension included the addition of a new "Small Hall", a larger kitchen and refurbished facilities. The Community Room involved working with the developers of Chilton Field, to ensure that we had a facility that would be functional and well used. His dedication to these two projects from start to finish, liaising with architects, builders and the Council was key to ensuring that the Village now has two buildings that the community can be proud of.

He is very much missed by us all on the Committee.

As such The VHMC wanted to honour Brian with a permanent and fitting tribute. So I am delighted to announce that the decision has been made to rename the small hall in the Village Hall to "The Morris Room". The change in name will be recognised with a plaque above the entrance to the room and the website will be amended accordingly.
