
Sales at 43 Crafts End

Councillors





Drone Flying and Personal Privacy

Whilst flying of drones can offer much enjoyment when equipped with cameras they can also pose a challenge to personal privacy. Some useful guidance on how to respect the personal privacy of others who may be in the vicinity, and so comply with the Code of Practice published by the Information Commissioners Office, is given by the Aviation Systems Group on their website https://asg.ltd/drones-and-privacy-law/. This guidance makes it clear that the pilot has a responsibility to consider the surroundings when flying a drone to ensure that the privacy of others, such as in their back garden, is respected.


