


Chilton Scarecrow Trail - We're going on a bug hunt!




Cryptic Quizzes

Threat to Bus Services

Back in July Oxfordshire County Council distributed a self-congratulatory letter about its ingenuity in gaining funds to support bus services: The County Council has been very successful in recent years in obtaining Section 106 funds from developers for the improvement of local bus services. In addition, the Council has secured £588,000 in one-off Government funds for the improvement of bus services in the financial year 2020/21.

Among the improvements it boasted was this one to be introduced in September 2020: Route X32 (Wantage – Harwell Village – Didcot) New evening and Sunday journeys (hourly) What the County Council omitted to mention was that the extension of Sunday buses to Wantage would be at the expense of Chilton, which lost its Sunday buses from 30 August. Another boast in the County Council's July letter was this change from January 2021: Route 94 (Harwell Campus -Chilton - Upton - Blewbury - East Hagbourne -**Didcot)** Route extended to/from Chilton and Harwell Campus. West Hagbourne will no longer be served, except by schooldays only route 94S which will continue unchanged. Service will start earlier and finish later to improve rail connections at Didcot. New Saturday service (six journeys each way)

Having been caught by the County Council's economy with the truth over the Sunday bus service, the Parish Council took the precaution of asking Thames Travel whether the extension of

route 94 would affect the X32 service to Chilton. Back came the reply:

Whilst I am confident that the X32 changes will, overall, be seen as an enhancement for most people, I'm afraid it does mean that the X32 will stop serving Chilton from next January. Instead the County Council supported 94 service will be re-routed to serve Chilton and Harwell Campus. This will provide a bus between Didcot and Chilton roughly every 90 minutes on Mondays to Saturdays.


The way these announcements normally happen is that we are told on Christmas Eve they will take effect from 1 January. Thanks to the percipience of the parish council in asking the question early on, we now have several months to argue for the village to retain its X32 buses, which provide a direct service to Oxford and Wantage as well as Didcot.

In addition, there are some practical problems with the route X32 being replaced by the route 94:

- The X32 route into Didcot passes Aureus School and UTC, the hospital, Woodlands Medical Centre, Didcot Girls' School and Didcot Health Centre. The 94 route into Didcot is from the East Hagbourne direction so it serves none of these places.
- The X32 is used by Aureus School and UTC students to return to Chilton in the afternoon. There is no indication yet of how they will get home if the X32 no longer serves the village.
- The section 106 funding raised by Oxfordshire County Council is finite, and the one-off government funds to support bus services are for 2020/1 only. What will happen to the 94 service after this funding runs out? The X32 is a commercial service so does not rely on subsidies from the county council or government.
- The 94 service will come over Hagbourne Hill to Chilton. During normal times when everybody is travelling to work, that route is congested at peak times because traffic is prevented from entering the

roundabout at the bottom of Hagbourne Hill by traffic leaving the southbound carriageway of the A34 and having priority. How will that be managed to prevent delays to the bus service?

The Parish Council has asked these questions of Thames Travel and our County Councillor. We will keep you informed of progress.






