Bus to Oxford and Wantage Reinstated

Thanks to Thames Travel who have reinstated through buses to Oxford at 0928 and Wantage at 0933 on Mondays to Fridays. This will be particularly useful to holders of concessionary bus passes who are entitled to free travel after 0900 on Mondays to Fridays.

The change, which took place at the beginning of September, is in response to representations from Chilton villagers and from our County Councillor, Stewart Lilly.

The summary timetable from 4 September for Chilton is attached to this edition of the Chronicle. Other changes on Mondays to Fridays include the first bus to Didcot and Oxford leaving earlier, at 0554 rather than 0616. For pupils at King Alfred's in Wantage the 0825 bus from Harwell Campus has been retimed to leave at 0810, arriving in Wantage at 0829 in time to walk to school.

Council Binning Black and Coloured Sacks in Recycling Bins

From November the Vale of White Horse District Council will only empty green wheelie bins if the recycling in them is loose or in clear sacks.

Despite a recent campaign to raise awareness of the issue, some people are still putting in things like food waste and dirty nappies, contaminating whole truckloads of recycling - when these things are put into recycling bins in black or coloured sacks they're not spotted until it's too late.

If there's a sack in a recycling bin and the waste crews can't see what's in it, they'll have to assume it contains contamination and won't empty it.
