Order for Apportionment and Manage-
ment under Local Government Act,

CHARITY COMMISSION.

In the Matter of the Charities called or known as The
HERDSMAN AND CHURCH ALLOTMENTS,
in the Parish of HARGRAVE, in the County of
NORTHAMPTON, of which Trustees were
appointed by an Order of the Charity Commis-
sioners of the 6th May 1870;

In the Matter of "The Local Government Act, 1894";

and

In the Matter of "The Charitable Trusts Acts, 1853
to 1894."

The Board of Charity Commissioners for England
and Wales, on an application made on behalf of the Trustees
of the above-mentioned Charities and the Parish Council of
Hargrave, being persons interested in the above-mentioned
Charities:

And it appearing that the endowments of the Charities (consisting of the particulars specified in the Schedule hereto, and all other the endowments, if any, of the Charities) are held in part only for purposes of Ecclesiastical Charities :

Do hereby, in execution of the provisions of section 75 (2) of the Local Government Act, 1894, **Order** as follows:—

1. The properties numbered 1, 2, and 3 respectively in the Schedule hereto are hereby separated from the rest of the endowments of the original Charities, and shall henceforth be the endowments of an Ecclesiastical Charity, to be called the Ecclesiastical Charity :

2. The Churchwardens for the time being of the Parish of Hargrave (being Trustees of the original Charities) shall be the Trustees of the Ecclesiastical Charity :

3. The properties numbered 4 and 5 in the said Schedule shall henceforth be the endowment of a Charity to be called the Non-ecclesiastical Charity :

4. The Trustees of the Non-ecclesiastical Charity shall consist of two persons to be appointed by the Parish Council of Hargrave for a term of four years in each case, but if at the end of two years from the date of the appointment of the first Trustees both remain Trustees, one of them, to be determined by lot if necessary, shall go out of office, but shall be eligible for re-appointment.
