CHARITY COMMISSION.

In the Matter of the Charity called the NON-ECCLESIASTICAL CHARITY, in the Parish of HARGRAVE, in the County of NORTHAMPTON, comprised in an Order made by the Charity Commissioners on the 31st January 1902 under the Local Government Act, 1894, s. 75 (2); and

In the Matter of "The Charitable Trusts Acts, 1853 to 1925."

The Board of Charity Commissioners for England and Wales, upon an application made to them on the 30th November 1926, in writing, signed by

WILLIAM FELLOWES CORBY, of Rushmere, Raunds, in the County of Northampton, Assistant Overseer; and

FREDERICK BRIGGS, of Hargrave, Agricultural Labourer;

the Trustees of the above-mentioned Charity:

And it appearing that the endowment of the Charity consists of the sum of £322 13s. 7d. 4 per cent. Funding Stock, 1960-90, held by "The Official Trustees of Charitable Funds":

And after due notice of the intention to make this Order published according to the direction of the Board by being affixed to or near a principal outer door of the Parish Church and the Wesleyan Methodist Chapel, Hargrave, on the 15th February 1927 (being more than one calendar month before the date hereof):

And having received no notice of any objection to the proposed Order or suggestion for the variation thereof:

And after due communication of the draft of the subjoined Scheme to the Parish Council of Hargrave:

Do hereby Order as follows:—

The subjoined Scheme is approved and established.

SCHEME.

The clear yearly income of the above-mentioned Charity shall be applied by the Trustees thereof towards defraying the cost of the lighting of the roads in the Parish of Hargrave, or for any other purposes for the public benefit of the inhabitants of the said Parish.
