Yesterday the Executive met in the Council Chamber at the Corby Cube. The Council's proposal to set a balanced budget was presented. The Executive endorsed the report and the budget proposals will now be considered by Council for approval on Thursday 23 February. Given the financial and service pressures the Council has and continues to face, the budget is considered to be a real achievement. UK aid agencies - including the British Red Cross, Oxfam and ActionAid - are joining together to raise money. Funds will go towards medical aid, emergency shelter, food and clean water.

The Council has started to produce and publish a Local Nature Recovery Strategy for the area. We will work with partner organisations, landowners and local communities over the coming months to create the strategy, mapping key wildlife habitats across the local area and identifying priorities to improve, increase and connect habitats.

The Bedford College Group and North Northamptonshire Council are working in partnership to deliver the Corby Sixth Form. Work has started on transforming Chisholm House into a new state of the art campus for 16 to 18-year-old students and is due to open in time for the start of the Autumn term. The Corby Sixth Form will be run by The Bedford College Group from Autumn 2023. The project is being facilitated through the Corby Towns Fund.

This week is National Apprenticeship Week, and we have been shining a light on the positive impact that apprenticeships make to individuals, businesses and the wider economy. Our apprenticeship scheme is going from strength to strength with 80 active learners having been employed.

Temperatures dropped below freezing again this week, activating the Council's Severe Weather Emergency Protocol (SWEPE) again. Our Rough Sleeping Team offered all known rough sleepers in the area emergency accommodation and a safe, warm, dry place to stay. The North Northamptonshire Warm Spaces initiative that the Council both runs and supports remains as important as ever. Please help us spread the message about local Warm Spaces to ensure that those who need them can access them.

The Council is offering residents across North Northamptonshire a new optional, chargeable, 12-month garden waste collection service. 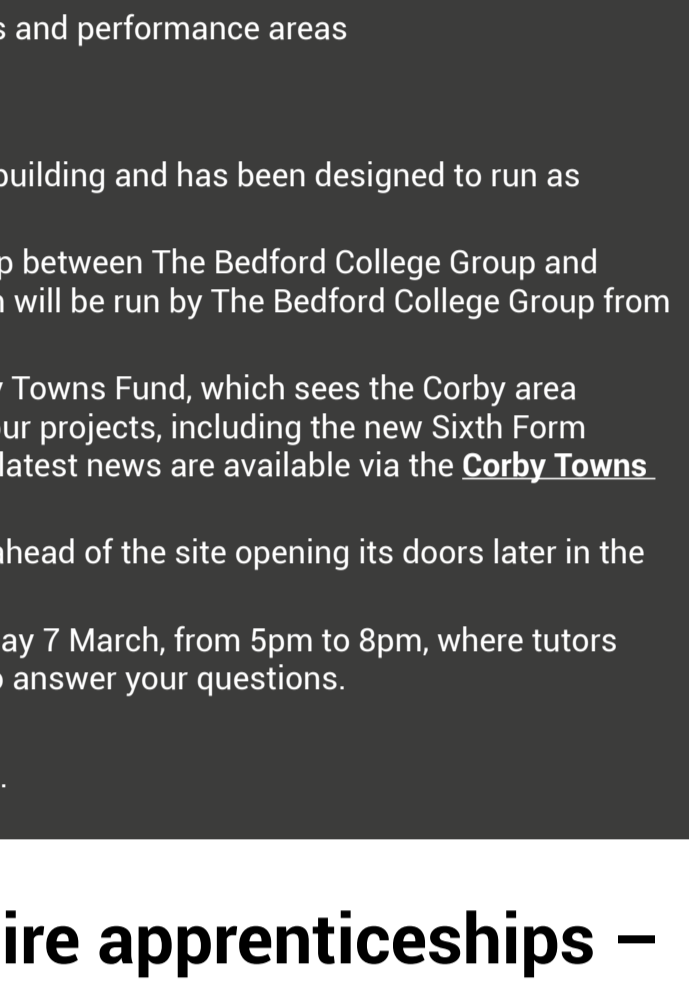
Turkey-Syria Earthquake Appeal

Construction work begins on Corby's new Sixth Form campus



Work has started on transforming Chisholm House in Corby into a new state of the art campus for 16 to 18-year-olds ahead of its opening in time for the start of the Autumn term. Once completed, the 4000 sq. ft. Corby Sixth Form will offer a wide range of A Level subjects.

Features

- Impressive new entrance
- More than 25 classrooms
- State of the art science labs, resource centres and performance areas
- External roof terrace
- Modern café and common room areas.

The design will embrace the current style of the building and has been designed to run as carbon neutral.

The new campus is being delivered in partnership between The Bedford College Group and North Northamptonshire Council. The Sixth Form will be run by The Bedford College Group from Autumn 2023.

The project is being facilitated through the Corby Towns Fund, which sees the Corby area receiving £19.9m from central Government for four projects, including the new Sixth Form Centre. More details about the four projects and latest news are available via the [Corby Towns Fund](#) website.

The Corby Sixth Form is accepting applications ahead of the site opening its doors later in the year.

Roles occupied by apprentices range from social workers, teachers and site engineers to departmental managers, finance and HR professionals and senior leaders.

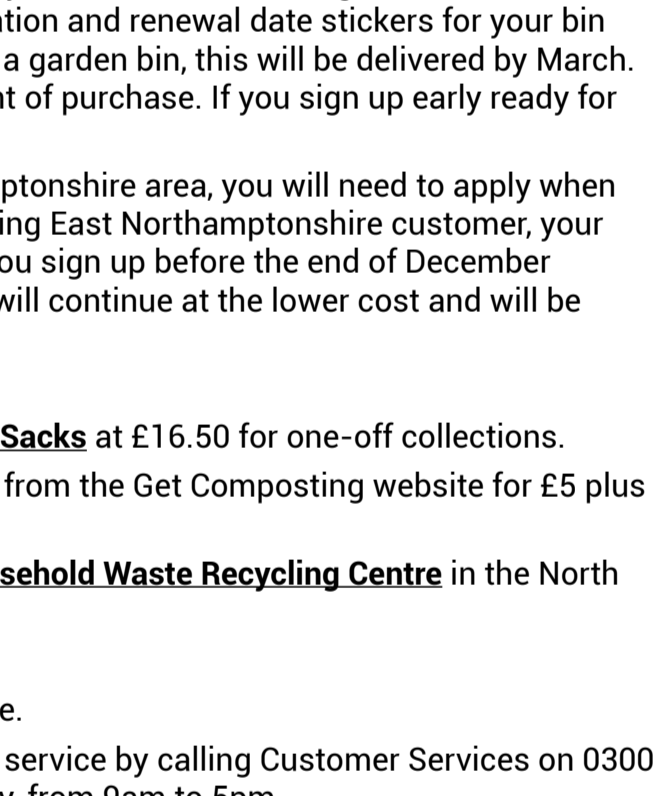
With no upper age limit to becoming an apprentice, an increasing number of people aged over 16 are favouring apprenticeships as a way of studying towards a formal qualification while working.

Raising awareness in North Northamptonshire of LGBT+ History Month

The Council is committed to ensuring everyone has access to safe and thriving places, which can only happen when everyone feels safe to be themselves. With this in mind, the Council was one of the first members, and biggest supporters, of the North Northants LGBT+ Forum at its inception in December 2021.

The forum is made up of community groups, private and statutory organisation, charities and members of the public including allies of the LGBT+ community. It is designed to discuss where the gaps are in services for the LGBT+ community within North Northamptonshire and work out how these can be resolved.

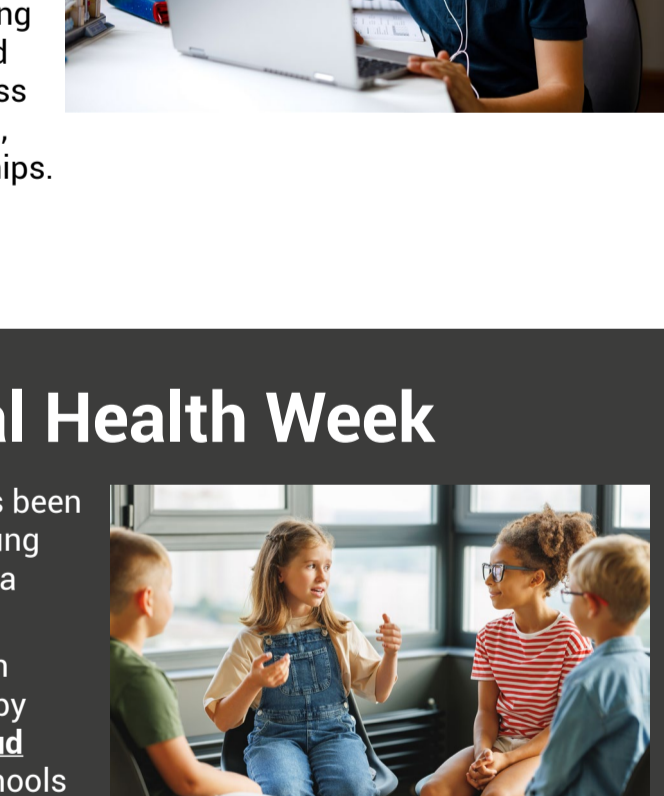

Learning Independence Volunteering Employment (LIVE) is a specialist team that provides bespoke support to individuals with learning disabilities and related barriers to employment. The LIVE Team sits within our Adult Social Care service.

Community projects

- **Free Coats for Kids** - over 100 coats given to children this Winter.
- **The Changing Room** - free interview and work clothing for job seekers.
- **The Cornerstone** - free clothing and essentials to people in need.

All donated clothes are sourced, steam cleaned, repaired and displayed. So far, the team has supported over 300 people with clothing. This reduces the amount of clothing that is sent to landfill centres.

The team works alongside local organisations including job centres, NHS Social and Disability Services (EADS), domestic abuse centres, the Rough Sleeping Team, NHS Mental Prescribers, local refugees groups, The Shack Food Project and the Soup Kitchen.

The team has also worked closely with local libraries and providers of Warm Spaces across North Northamptonshire this Winter.

I am immensely proud of the LIVE Team's achievements and commitment during challenging times. I look forward to hearing more news as their projects and good work reach further into the community.

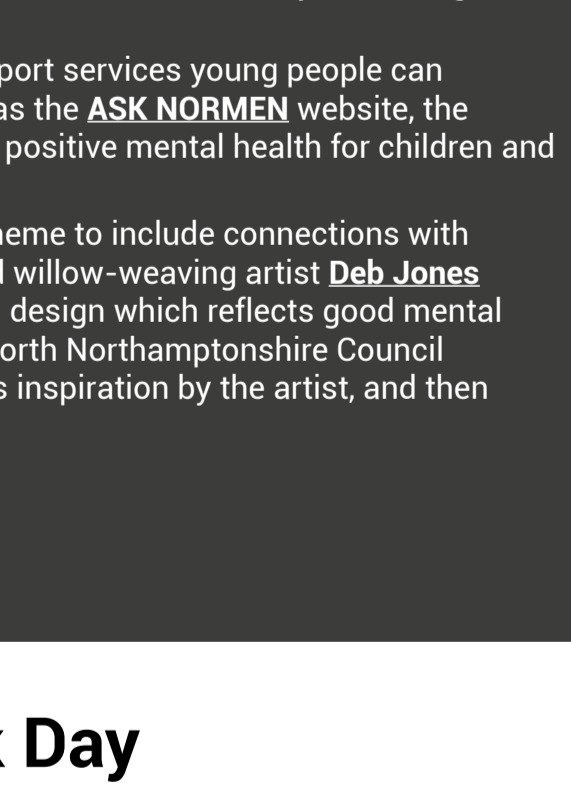

Garden waste collection service: Your options

The Council is offering residents across North Northamptonshire a new optional, chargeable, 12-month garden waste collection service. The annual subscription charge for the fortnightly service, with collections starting on Monday 3 April, is £40 per bin. There are alternative options for those not wanting or needing a bin, which are outlined below.

If you want to subscribe and renew

You will need to pay an annual subscription of £40 by debit or credit card. You can **sign up online**, ready for collections starting in the first two weeks of April, at any time. You are required to register and renewal date delivered by your bin (in February if subscribing in advance). If you need a garden bin, this will be supplied for March. Your subscription will last 12 months from the point of purchase. If you sign up early ready for the change, it will run from April to April.

If you are currently subscribed in the East Northamptonshire area, you will need to apply when your current subscription expires. If you're an existing East Northamptonshire customer, your first bin subscription will be discounted to £20 (if you sign up before the end of December 2023). If you're already paying by direct debit, this will continue at the lower cost and will be automatically discontinued.

If you don't want or need a bin

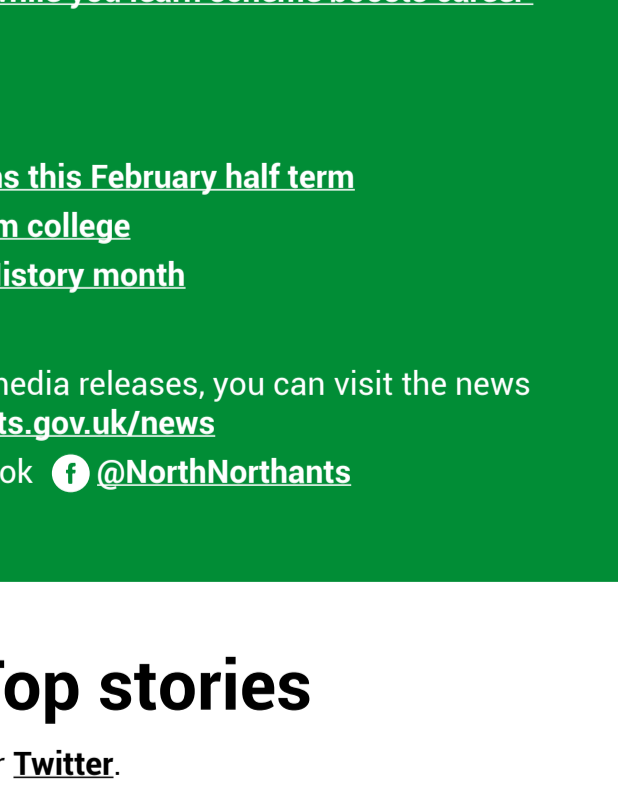
You can **order 10 compostable NNC Garden Waste Sacks** at £16.50 for one-off collections. You can **order a discounted 220L home composter** from the Get Composting website for £5 plus delivery.

You can also take green waste to your nearest **Household Waste Recycling Centre** in the North Northamptonshire area for free disposal.

Open activities on the Consultation and Engagement Hub

Please find below details of our open consultation and engagement activities. I would welcome your feedback on the following:

- **Local Government Boundary Commission for England - North Northamptonshire Electoral Review.** North Northamptonshire Council has been asked to promote the next round of consultation activities. A new pattern of wards is being developed with a change to council ward numbers. Views on which communities should be part of the same ward, which facilities are shared and common issues for neighbouring communities are also being sought. Closes 6 March 2023 (extended from 6 February 2023).

- **Chanwood Park Secondary School Education.** In February 2021, as part of the Wave 14 free school application process, Orbis Education Trust (OET) had a bid approved to open a new secondary free school for boys on the Chanwood Park Sustainable Urban Extension (SUE), by the Department for Education (DfE). The Council and OET are seeking views as to whether the new school should be a boys school (as initially planned) or be a mixed sex provision. Closes 5 March 2023.

Time to Talk Day

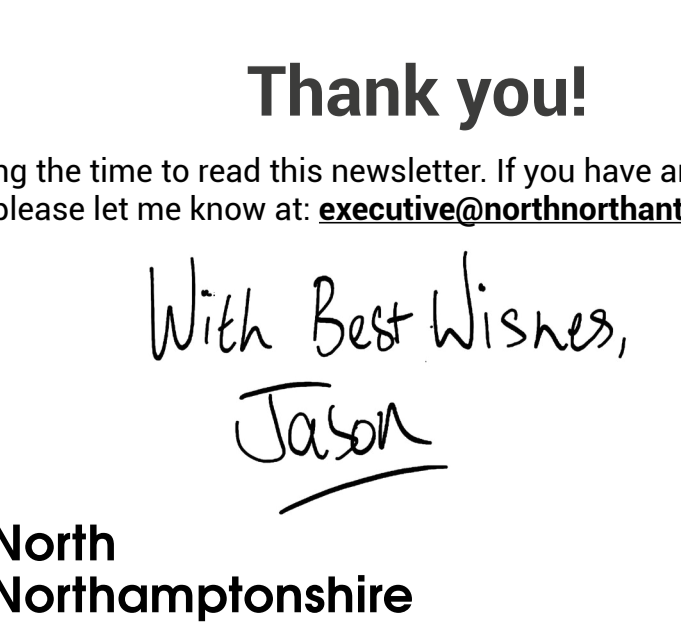

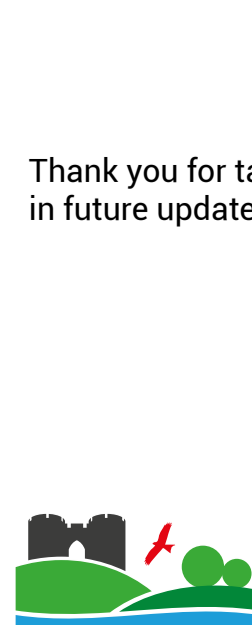
