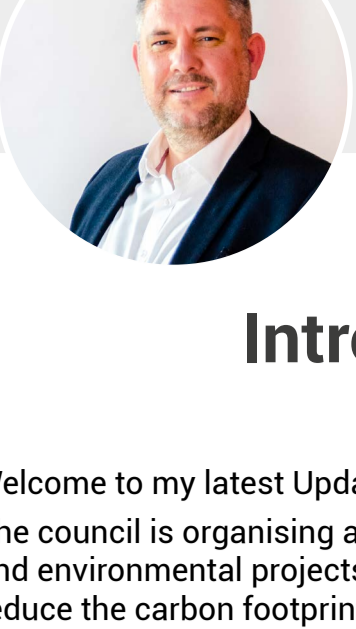

Welcome to my latest Update.

The council is organising a third climate change conference that will showcase sustainability and environmental projects in North Northamptonshire. NNClimate23 will take place online to reduce the carbon footprint of the event. It will be broadcast live on YouTube on Wednesday 22 November.

North Northamptonshire Council's annual climate change conference will take place this month showcasing projects aimed at improved sustainability and helping the environment.

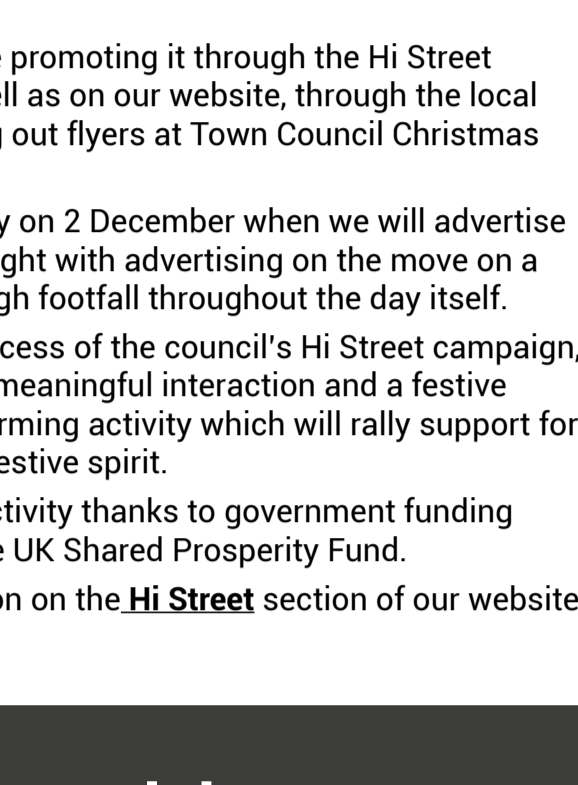
NNClimate23 will be broadcast live on YouTube on Wednesday 22 November starting at 9:30am.

Christmas is coming, and so is the 'Hi Santa Stops' festive trail

The festive season is a time for celebration, spreading joy, and coming together as a community. In North Northamptonshire, Christmas spirit will come to life with the launch of the 'Hi Santa Stops' trail.

This interactive trail is the festive element of the Hi Street campaign and will not only be a fun-filled adventure for children, adults, and families, but also a meaningful endeavour to support local businesses, engage the community, and promote the campaign in 14 local towns.

The trail is designed to spotlight local businesses and encourage residents and visitors to the area to use them during the lead up to Christmas. Whether that be shopping, socialising, or using business, health, hair or beauty services, there is something for everyone, and the trail is an entertaining activity which provides a fun opportunity for people to explore different towns and enjoy time out and about together.

How 'Hi Santa Stops' works

'Hi Santa Stops' is an interactive audio experience linked to QR codes hosted in 56 local businesses, in 14 North Northamptonshire towns.

People taking part will choose an area and explore different businesses there to find and scan the QR code to unlock a magical festive audio message from Santa Claus which will include a letter.

They will need to collect 8 letters to make up a Christmas word, which they will then submit online for a chance to win vouchers to use at local businesses to the value of £500.

The trail will launch mid-November and run during the lead up to Christmas, giving people plenty of time to explore and complete it at their leisure. Participants will be invited to collect a sweet bag of festive treats as a reward for doing the trail, sourced from two local confectionery businesses.

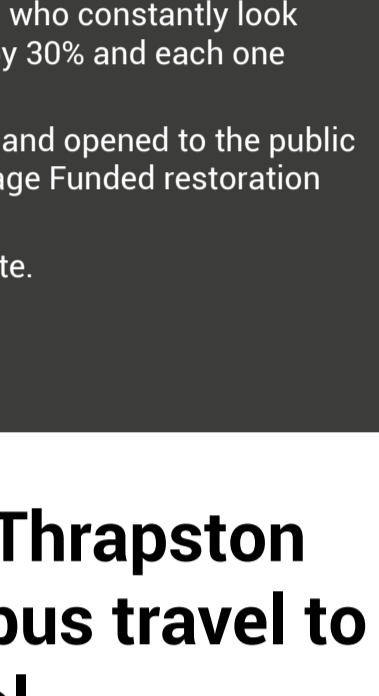
Everyone is invited to take part in the trail, and we will be promoting it through the Hi Street and Council campaign channels and social media, as well as on our website, through the local businesses taking part, in school newsletters, and giving out flyers at Town Council Christmas events.

There will also be promotion on Small Business Saturday on 2 December when we will advertise the trail, and put supporting local messages in the spotlight with advertising on the move on a digital Ivan, which will travel to various locations with high footfall throughout the day itself.

The 'Hi Santa Stops' Christmas trail will build on the success of the council's Hi Street campaign, bringing the brand to life in town centres by providing a meaningful interaction and a festive talking point. It promises to be an exciting and heart-warming activity which will rally support for local businesses and foster a sense of community and festive spirit.

We are able to deliver this exciting Christmas-themed activity thanks to government funding awarded to North Northamptonshire Council through the UK Shared Prosperity Fund.

Chester House Estate celebrates two years of visitors

Last week, Chester House Estate celebrated two years since it opened its doors to the public.

In a short space of time, the nationally significant heritage site has gone from strength to strength and has welcomed over 250,000 visitors.

The Chester House Estate is now firmly embedded into the community, with on-site businesses thriving and visitors flocking to the events.

Highlights

- Over 40 events (Halloween, Christmas, outdoor music nights, Roman re-enactments and children's events throughout the school holidays).
- 4,000 pupils attending events, archaeological digs and educational trips in the past year.
- Storyboards showcasing the site's 10,000 years of history.
- Memorial garden for Queen Elizabeth II.
- Escape rooms.

Two pedestrian bridges over the River Nene now link Wellingborough, Irchester and Rushden with the estate, and have greatly improved local access.

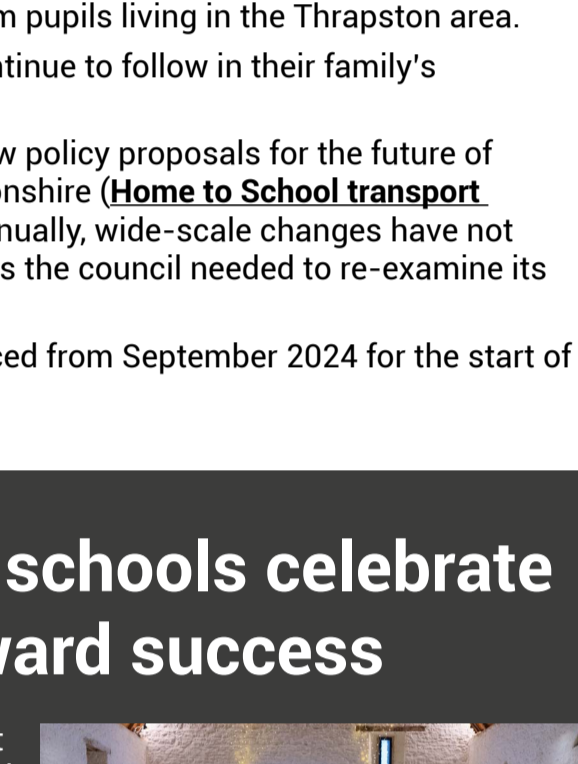
The continued success is thanks to the dedicated staff and volunteers who constantly look to innovate and develop the offering. The volunteers base has grown by 30% and each one becomes part of the 'Chester House Estate family'.

Chester House Estate is overseen by North Northamptonshire Council and opened to the public in October 2021, following an extensive £17m Nationally Lottery Heritage Funded restoration project.

The council has ambitious long-term plans to further develop the estate.

Secondary school children in Thrapston and Islip to keep statutory free bus travel to Prince William School

Following a review of our new Home to School' policy, we can confirm that school children under the age of 16 in Thrapston and Islip can continue to benefit from statutory free bus travel to Prince William School in Oundle.

It was recognised that children of secondary school age at Thrapston and Islip have historically been sent to Prince William School. It is, however, a school which is not geographically nearest and, in line with the new policy, free transport was at risk.

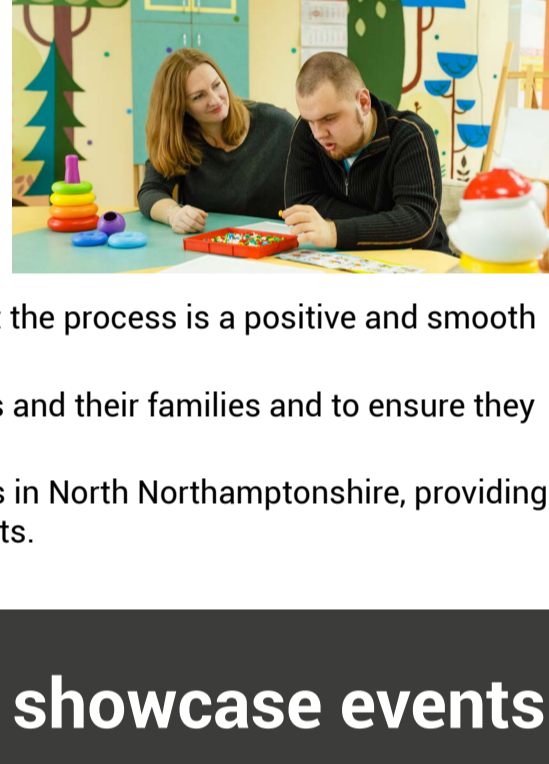
The council reviewed the new policy in line with the Department for Education's (DfE) definition and confirmed that a school may be considered 'suitable', and therefore eligible for statutory free transport, under the admissions criteria if a school which is geographically nearer is full.

It has been recognised that whilst Thrapston is nearer to Manor School than to Prince William School, Manor School regularly has limited spare capacity and therefore is not suitable for supporting the significant demand for school places from pupils living in the Thrapston area.

The new policy means that younger generations can continue to follow in their family's footsteps.

Earlier this year, people were asked for their views on new policy proposals for the future of Home to School transport provided in North Northamptonshire ([Home to School transport policy review consultation 2023](#)). Although refreshed annually, wide-scale changes have not been introduced for about a decade, and with rising costs the council needed to re-examine its approach and the amount it can afford to subsidise.

The new Home to School policy changes will be introduced from September 2024 for the start of the 2024-2025 academic year.



North Northamptonshire schools celebrate Healthy Schools Award success

Teaching staff from across North Northamptonshire met recently to share their success in achieving the new North Northants Healthy Schools Bronze Award.

Representatives from the nine schools, who are the first to complete the award in North Northamptonshire, were presented with their certificates from the Healthy Schools Team at Chester House Estate.

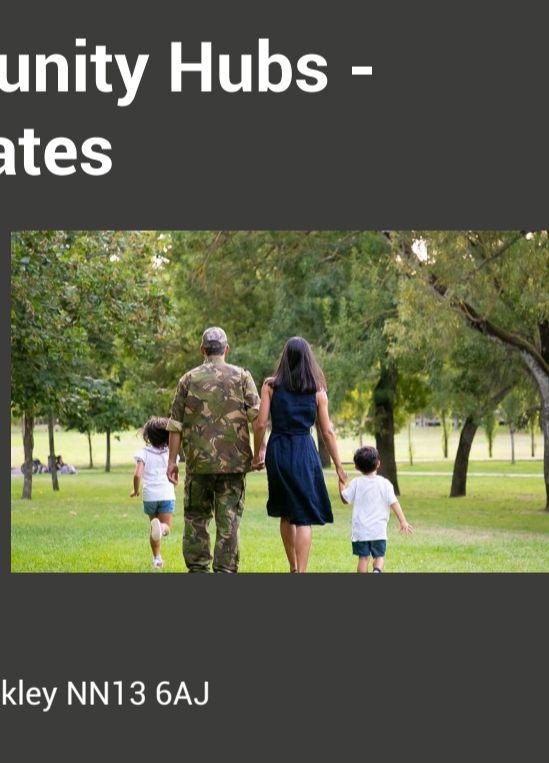
To achieve the North Northants Healthy Schools Bronze Award, the schools had to provide evidence of a 'whole school' approach to mental health and wellbeing, healthy eating and physical activity, as well as personal, social, health and economic education (PSHE).

The nine schools are:

- Dendfield Park Primary School, Rushden
- Grange Primary Academy, Kettering
- Higham Ferrers Junior School, Rushden
- Leatlands Primary School, Kettering
- Meadowside Primary School, Burton Latimer
- St. Mary's C.E. Primary Academy, Burton Latimer
- Studfall Infant School, Corby
- Studfall Junior School, Corby
- Whrenn Spinney School, Kettering.

Another 44 schools are in the process of working towards their Bronze Healthy Schools Award, which is available free of charge to all schools in North Northamptonshire.

Discussions held with National Autistic Society

Representatives from North Northamptonshire Council met with senior staff from the National Autistic Society recently to discuss the future of support services in the local area.

The two organisations agreed to a 6-month extension to the services provided, allowing for both parties to find a more permanent, long-term solution for support users in North Northamptonshire.

The council will be working closely with those impacted to identify the most suitable route forward and to ensure that the process is a positive and smooth one.

Our priority has always been those who use these services and their families and to ensure they are receiving the right care in the appropriate setting.

The National Autistic Society delivers services to 25 adults in North Northamptonshire, providing residential care, supported living and learning arrangements.

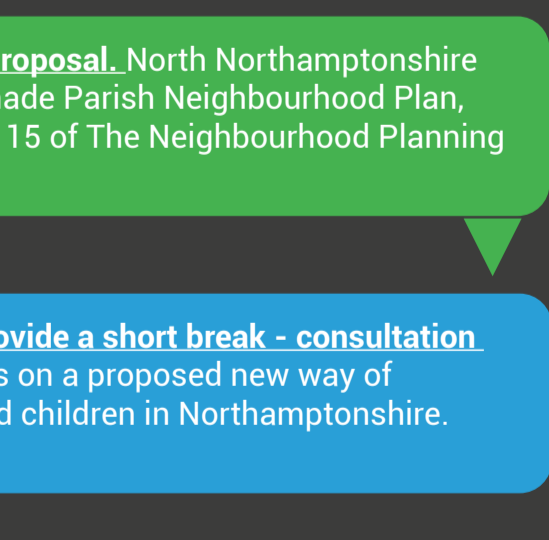


Remembrance Day 2023

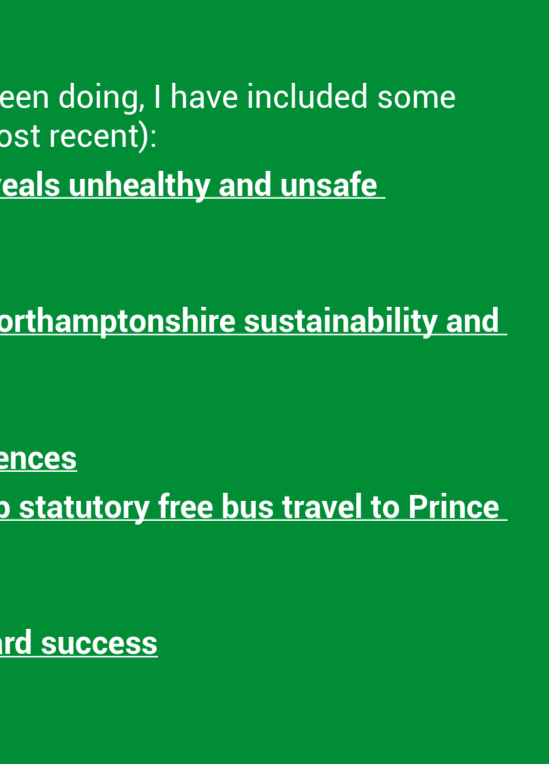
Armed Forces Covenant Northamptonshire provides information and advice on support services available within the county for the Armed Forces community and their families.

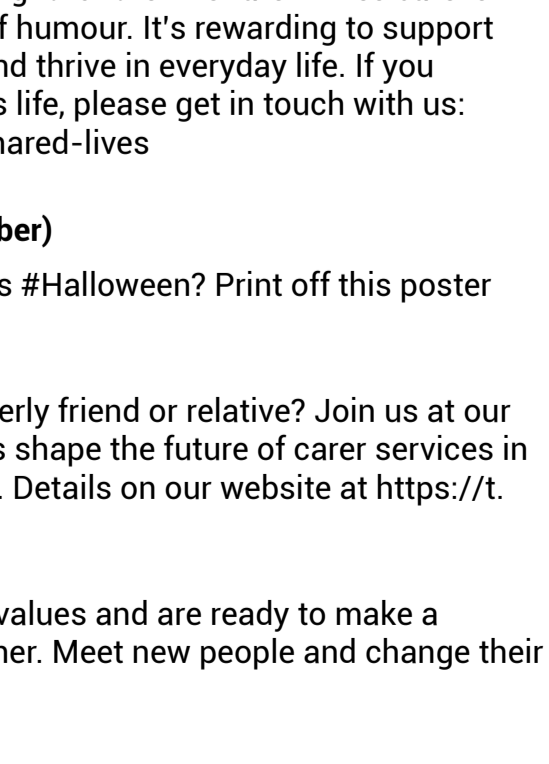

Have your say on taxi de-zoning

A consultation has been launched to review the existing taxi zones across North Northamptonshire.

Earlier in 2023, North Northamptonshire Council's Executive approved a consultation to consider whether the four current zones should be retained or replaced with one zone for North Northamptonshire.

When North Northamptonshire Council was formed, for the purposes of taxi licensing, the previous former authority area zones were retained: Corby, East Northamptonshire, Kettering and Wellingborough.

Each zone continues to licence its own taxis and drivers as well as operate to the byelaws currently in existence for that former area. It also means that a driver and vehicle wishing to operate across the whole of North Northamptonshire would need to obtain four licences.

The [North Northamptonshire Hackney Carriage de-zoning and byelaw review](#) consultation will be open until 21 January 2024.

Consultation launched on Corby Towns Fund projects

Residents are invited to have their say on revised plans for pedestrian and cycle routes between Corby town centre and train station.

The Corby Station Link Road and Smart and Connected Corby are two of the projects within the Corby Towns Fund which North Northamptonshire Council was awarded £19.9m from the government to deliver.

In September 2022, residents were asked for their views on the proposed, original designs after which the comments were received and collated into common issues and themes. The common issues and comments were evaluated, and alternatives were investigated, after which the scheme was revised and an alternative plan put forward.

In May 2023, North Northamptonshire Council completed a 'You said, we did' exercise which set out the comments and themes received and how the initial plans have been altered to mitigate these issues.

Now, residents and stakeholders are being asked to view and comment on the new, amended plans. The current Corby Towns Fund consultation will be open until Friday 22 December.

From Wednesday 1 November to Friday 22 December, information boards will be on display, alongside paper copies of the questionnaire, at the Corby Cube. There will also be staffed events, where residents can speak to staff and ask questions, between 10am and 4pm on:

- Tuesday 28 November
- Thursday 30 November
- Monday 4 December
- Wednesday 6 December
- Friday 8 December

For those unable to attend, feedback can be provided through the dedicated [Corby Towns Fund](#) website.

The information will be gathered in early 2024 to identify any issues and comments which can be addressed as detailed design work continues. It is currently anticipated that work will start on the sensor network in Winter/Spring 2024.

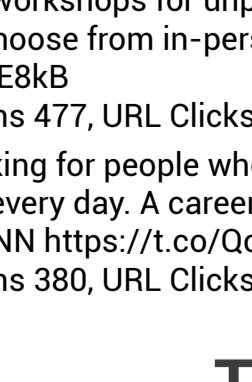
