Welcome to my latest Update.

It's the beginning of Spring in ten days' time but it's still looking very Wintry outside. Due to the freezing temperatures, the Council's SWEPE (Severe Weather Emergency Protocol) was activated this week and will be in place until Monday. Our Rough Sleeping Team will continue to offer all known rough sleepers in the area emergency accommodation, so they have somewhere safe, warm, and dry to stay.

The North Northamptonshire Warm Spaces initiative is still running. Warm Spaces provide a place where people can go to, for free, to enjoy warmth and have a hot drink. Please feel free to access them if you need to and spread the word.

With two months to go until the Coronation of His Majesty The King and Her Majesty The Queen Consort, I have included some information to help those preparing for events in this Update. It was announced earlier this week that residents in North Northamptonshire have ridden over one million miles on e-scooters since Voi scooters were introduced in the area two years ago. This is a significant milestone and it means that thousands of residents can travel in a greener and more cost-effective way.

Supporting children in their education is a priority for the council and moving up to secondary school is a big step on their educational journey. Last week a total of 4,225 secondary school places were allocated to pupils across North Northamptonshire. Over 95% of applicants have been allocated one of their preferred schools and 80% were offered a place at their first choice of secondary school.

Following a recent competition to name our gritting lorries, we are delighted to announce the winning names that will be painted on the front of 10 trucks. The online competition attracted hundreds of witty suggestions from residents and school classes from across North Northamptonshire. Thank you to everyone who entered the competition.

Severe Weather Emergency Protocol (SWEPE) is now active

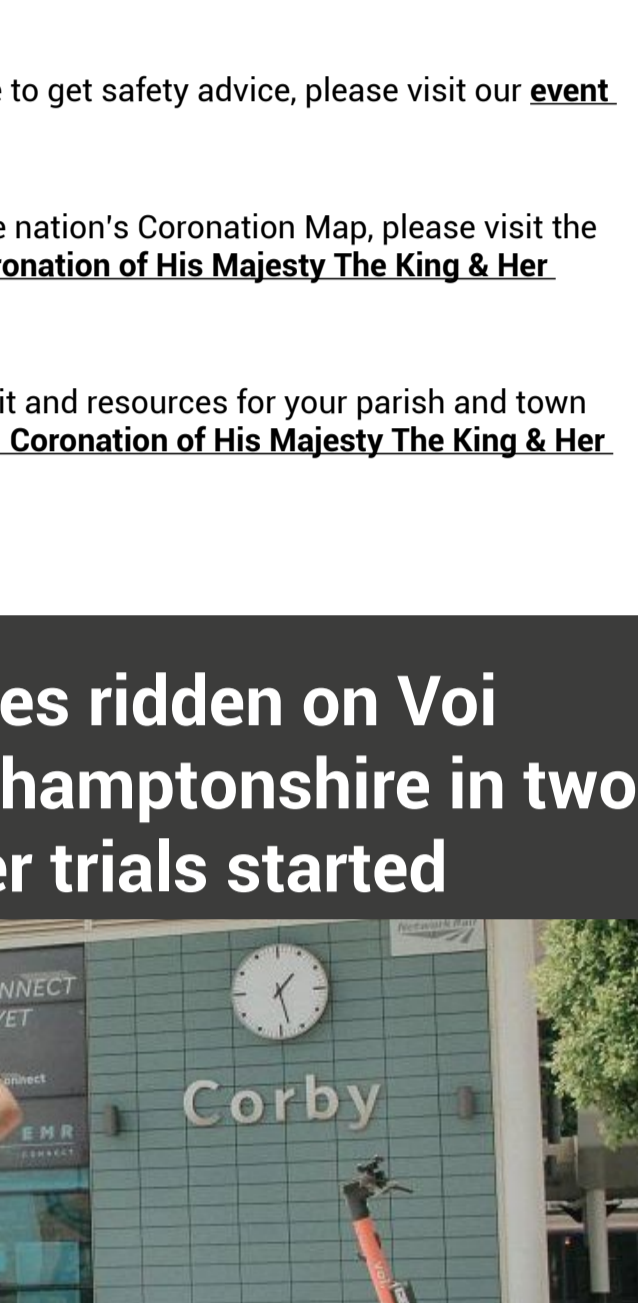

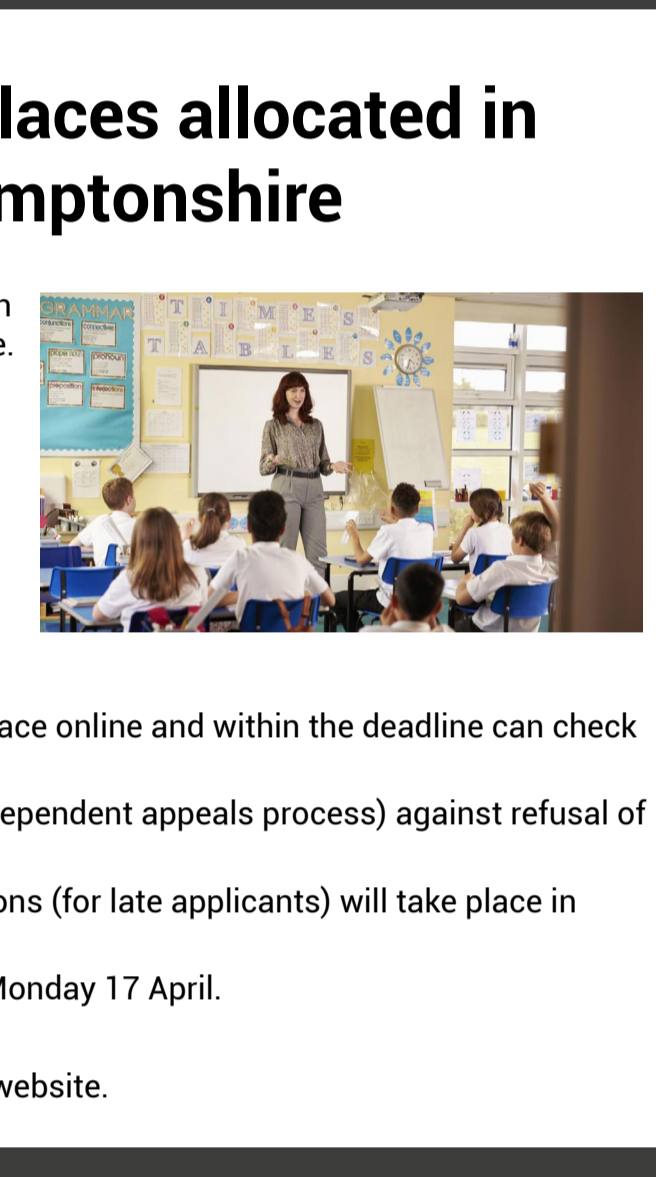
Food support and warm spaces

A map of organisations offering food and warm spaces is available on our website.

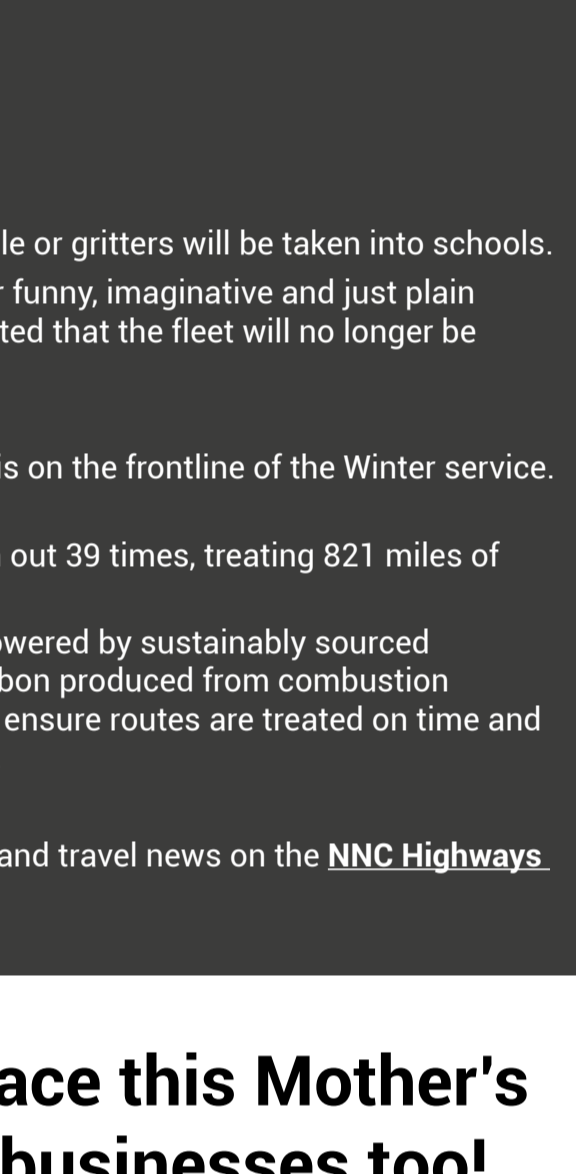

Over one million miles ridden on Voi e-scooters in North Northamptonshire in two years since scooter trials started

E-scooter users have ridden over one million miles in North Northamptonshire since Voi scooters were introduced in the county two years ago.

Since the trials were set up in Kettering, Burton Latimer, Wellingborough, Corby, Rushden and Higham Ferrers in February and March 2021, e-scooters have gone from strength to strength. Over 37,000 people have taken over 1 million rides on e-scooters, covering a distance of 1.05 million miles around North Northamptonshire.

The e-scooter trial in Northampton was set up over a year earlier, in September 2020, since when there have been 2.4 million rides, covering 3.7 million miles.

According to independent research into the economic impact of e-scooters on Northamptonshire's economy, the trial schemes are expected to boost high street spending in the county by more than £7.6 million for the duration of the trial schemes.

- A survey of riders using Voi scooters in Northamptonshire found that:
- 50% of people were using them at least once a week.
- 27.12% of riders scoot between once a month and a few times a month.
- Just under 58% of riders use e-scooters for journeys of up to 15 minutes a day.
- Over 53% of riders said they are using Voi e-scooters to travel to places they previously couldn't because the journey was either too long, too expensive or because there wasn't public transport available for the journey.

The Northamptonshire e-scooter scheme has just been shortlisted in two categories in this year's LGC awards, which celebrate excellence in local government, beating hundreds of other entries.

North Northamptonshire Council submitted an entry for the public-private sector partnership category. West Northamptonshire Council submitted an entry in the climate response category for its partnerships with Voi and Liberty Charge offering sustainable travel options in Northampton.

Following this positive news, I would like to take this opportunity to remind users of the importance of safety whilst out and about, to wear a helmet when travelling by Voi e-scooter and not to ride on the pavement.



Secondary school places allocated in North Northamptonshire

A total of 4,225 secondary school places have been allocated to pupils across North Northamptonshire. More people than ever before made their applications online – the figure stands at 99%.

Allocations

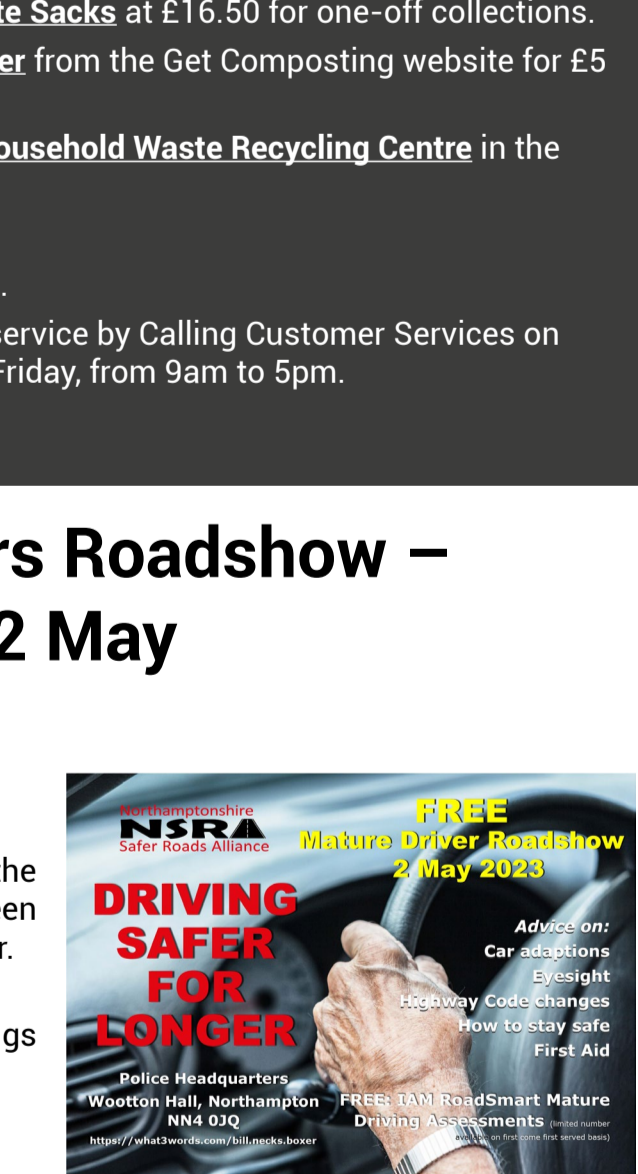
- First of their preferred schools: 95.2%.
- First preference: 80.05%.
- Second preference: 12.1%.
- Third preference: 3.05%.

Families who applied for their secondary school place online and within the deadline can check their offer online.

Any parent has the right to appeal (through the independent appeals process) against refusal of a place at any school for which they have applied.

The next round of secondary school place allocations (for late applicants) will take place in April. Primary school allocations will be announced on Monday 17 April.

About the gritting fleet
The gritting of roads starts on October until mid-April. Since October last year, the Kier Highways fleet has been out 39 times, treating 821 miles of roads every time, to keep them open and safe for all.

The fleet has been updated with new vehicles that are powered by sustainably sourced Hydrotreated Vegetable Oil (HVO), which reduces the carbon produced from combustion engines by up to 90%. They also have new technology to ensure routes are treated on time and that salt is used where it is needed most, reducing costs.

Our Local Land Charges Team shortlisted for national award

The Local Land Charges (LLC) Team at North Northamptonshire Council has made the shortlist for the Best Performing Local Land Charges Department at the 2023 Land Data Awards for Excellence. These are the only awards to recognise excellence and achievement in the profession.

The team manages thousands of land and property searches each year and is an essential part of the home buying and selling process for residents.

The winners of the award, sponsored by the National Land Information Service (NLIS), will be announced at the Land Data Local Land Charges Awards for Excellence on Tuesday 28 March.

For this award, the judging panel assesses NLIS Hub data collected between 1 October 2021 and 30 September 2022 on electronic turnaround times, the level of overdue searches, and search accuracy and volumes, which are weighted against transactional volumes for the authority's area. The results are combined and ranked to create the shortlist.

The council strives to provide a customer-focused service and to maintain a quick turnaround time for customers. This is the second time the team have been nominated for this award and it's great for them to receive national recognition for all their hard work.

Garden waste collection service: Have you signed up yet?

Our new optional, chargeable, 12-month garden waste collection service will soon be available to residents across North Northamptonshire. The annual subscription charge for the fortnightly service, with collections starting on Monday 3 April, is £40 per bin.

There are alternative options for those not wanting or needing a bin, which are outlined below.

If you want to subscribe and renew
You will need to pay an annual subscription of £40 by debit or credit card. You can sign up online, ready for collections starting in the first two weeks of April, at any time. You will receive registration and renewal date stickers for your bin (in February if subscribing in advance). If you need a garden bin, this will be delivered by March. Your subscription will last 12 months from the point of purchase. If you sign up early ready for the change, it will run from April to April.

If you are currently subscribed in the East Northamptonshire area, you will need to apply when your current subscription expires. If you're an existing East Northamptonshire customer, your first bin subscription will be discounted to £20 (if you sign up before the end of December 2022). If you're already paying by direct debit, this will continue at the lower cost and will be automatically discounted.

- If you don't want or need a bin
- You can order 10 compostable NNC Garden Waste Sacks at £16.50 for one-off collections.
- You can order a discounted 220L home composter from the Get Composting website for £5 plus delivery.
- You can also take green waste to your nearest Household Waste Recycling Centre in the North Northamptonshire area for free disposal.

Free Mature Drivers Roadshow – Tuesday 2 May

Are you a mature driver (aged 60+)? Live in Northamptonshire? Rely on being able to drive? This free roadshow is for you!

Driving is an important part of our everyday life and the Northamptonshire Safer Roads Alliance (NSRA) is keen to help to keep mature drivers driving safer for longer.

The NSRA was established to implement the Northamptonshire Strategic Road Safety Plan. It brings together partners from all different agencies with an interest in road safety (including Northamptonshire Police, East Midlands Ambulance Service, Northamptonshire Highways and Northamptonshire Fire and Rescue).

Our driving ability to drive changes over time for different reasons, especially as we get older. It's important that we recognise whether and how our driving is changing so we can stay safe and protect both ourselves and those around us.

The Mature Drivers Roadshow will cover all different aspects of driving. There will be a short talk and then plenty of time to meet informally with the many stand holders. Free advice will be available on car adaptations, eyesight, Highway code changes, how to stay safe, first aid, how your prescription medications may affect you, and much more.

A limited number of free IAM RoadSmart Mature Driver Assessments will be available on a first come, first served basis.
