The Big Picnic Lunch event still took place at Wicksteed Park - thank you to those of you who braved the weather to attend.

In other news, I thought it would be useful to provide a reminder that we currently have two public consultations open. One on the UK Shared Prosperity Fund which closes on 22 June. The other is on the North Northamptonshire Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Licensing Policy and <u>Conditions</u> which closes on 27 July. Please take part in these consultations if you would like to have your say.

North Northamptonshire Council is proud to be celebrating Pride Month throughout June. This is a significant year for the Pride movement and the LGBT+ community as we celebrate 50 years since the first Pride took place in the United Kingdom. We are flying the flag on our website homepage and have given our social media platforms a makeover.

Last, but by no means least, here are a couple of dates for your diaries. The Council's Executive will be meeting at the Council Chamber in the Corby Cube on Thursday 16 June at 10am. North Northamptonshire Council identifies Kier as their future highways service provider

Following a thorough procurement process, we have now identified Kier as the preferred bidder for our new highways contract.

This will be the first highways contract to be awarded since North Northamptonshire Council came into existence in April 2021.

Worth approximately £30m a year, it is one of the highest value contracts awarded by the Council and is set to run for seven years, with the potential to extend to a maximum of 14 years.

Highways maintenance has been delivered



Northamptonshire-wide by KierWSP under arrangements inherited from the previous county council. Starting afresh from the previous arrangement, the new contract has been significantly updated to align with the challenges faced today and over the next decade and beyond. The deal has been drawn up to ensure that there is provision for a safe, legal, customerfocused and value for money service while also making tangible contributions to the Council's commitment to social value and its response to climate change and protecting the environment. The new contract is due to start on 12 September 2022.

New short-term home care service to commence in July

North Northamptonshire Council's Adult Social Care Commissioning Team is pleased to announce and introduce TuVida as the service provider awarded to deliver what was formerly known as the H2H service.

TuVida will be supporting hospital discharges, assisting with hospital avoidance, and providing short-term enabling care and support to older people living in their own homes. Who are TuVida?

As a charity that has been delivering care for over 30 years, they operate as a 'not-for-profit'

organisation, which means they put monies back into the care delivered, pay higher wages and give greater benefits where possible. They offer themselves as a leader in providing high quality, at-home care services to individuals. TuVida is a charity that provides care to people to help them live independently in the comfort of their own homes, and also provides information, guidance and support for unpaid family carers.

The service will commence in July and will work collaboratively with Health and Social teams as well as voluntary sector partners to ensure the overall wellbeing of individuals living in our local communities.

National changes to bus lane enforcement to affect North Northamptonshire

Fines for the illegal use of bus lanes have increased from £60 to £70 as part of a change in national legislation introduced by the Government. The increase, from May 31, will affects all Council areas which issue Penalty Charge Notices for the contravention of traffic regulations in bus lanes. In North Northamptonshire, this applies to the Gloucester Place bus gate linking Church Street to Cambridge Street/Market Street and the bus lane in Sheep Street in Wellingborough town centre. Additionally, the initial period during which the payment of fines is discounted has increased from 14 days to 21 days.

Both changes bring the rules regarding bus lane contraventions into line with legislation regarding civil parking enforcement.

The measures were brought in locally to reduce congestion in Wellingborough so that bus journey times could be more reliable and hence more attractive for the travelling public. Encouraging people to use more sustainable modes of transport is one component of reducing carbon emissions in North Northamptonshire and creating a cleaner, greener environment.

Do Summer Safely: We're supporting Counter Terrorism Policing's summer vigilance campaign

This campaign aims to encourage the public to report anything which 'doesn't feel right' and to 'trust their instincts'. The key message is 'Let's look out for each other, so whilst you're out and about this summer, stay vigilant.'

Work starts soon on Chester House river bridges

KierWSP Northamptonshire Highways, working on behalf of North Northamptonshire Council, will soon start work to install the two much needed and longawaited pedestrian bridges over the River Nene at Chester House, Little Irchester, Wellingborough.

Destroyed by arson years ago and closed to the public since 2015, designers from highways have been working with a number of associated parties to agree the design of the two new metal structures that will complete the important links between Wellingborough, Irchester and Rushden at this nationally significant heritage site.

Chester House opened in 2021, however, due to the nature of the site and the consents required for any change to the existing layout and structures, it has taken some time to get to this point and agree both the design and obtain all the required permissions. Funded by the Department for Transport, the bridges are currently being manufactured and will

arrive on site later in the summer. Visitors will start to see works in early June as the team installs a works compound and haul road which will have the capacity to carry heavy vehicles and plant.

The scheme is expected to take 12 weeks and, as soon as the work is safely completed, the bridge will open to the public. Updates will be provided via Twitter @nnhighways and @ChesterHouse_UK as well as on Chester House Estate - Facebook.

Students are on board to create gateway to the Greenway





with North Northamptonshire Council as the Out to Water, Into History (OTWIH) project goes full steam-ahead with its next Greenway milestone.

Funded by the Heritage Lottery, through the Nenescape Partnership, the OTWIH project provides a clear link and nicer green corridor, linking the new and old Rushden. Using part of the old railway line in the town, the project includes the installation of a welcoming gateway. Some 78 students from Moulton College are



jumping on board the project to help design and create the gateway to the Greenway. Situated at the entrance to the pathway, near Dove Motors at Crown Park Rushden, the gateway is a collaborative piece of art inspired by the Greenway users and Rushden communities.

The project team held a consultation with Greenway users in September 2021 to help influence how the gateway should look. This invaluable feedback is the foundation for what the students will use to design and create the artwork, due to be installed later this year.

Using their skills in bricklaying, plumbing, carpentry and horticulture, the first and second year students will be part of a project that will celebrate the rich heritage of the town and how it has involved into one of North Northamptonshire's most beautiful locations.

We are extremely proud of the Greenway, it is a brilliant community asset that we continue to work on and build, but we couldn't do so without the help of our dedicated team of volunteers and our partners.

Nationally recognised anti-violence sculpture wowed those who saw it

Corby had the honour of welcoming the extremely striking and thought-provoking sculpture, the Knife Angel. Designed by artist, Alfie Bradley, it aims to raise awareness around knife violence and the devastating impact it has on victims, families and communities. The sculpture, made from over 100,000 seized blades, was specifically created to highlight the negative effects of violent behaviour and act as a memorial to the victims and families affected by knife crime and other forms of violence/ aggression. The sculpture travels across the UK to educate children, young people and adults about the harmful effect violence has on communities.

Council moves members of staff from **One Angel Square to offices in North** Northamptonshire

North Northamptonshire Council has recently moved a number of teams that had continued to be based at One Angel Square in Northampton to office accommodation in North Northamptonshire. The moves were part of a planned process and the staff involved have been very supportive in helping the process run smoothly.

Customers should continue to access services as they have done previously unless they are informed of any specific changes.

- The moves involved the following teams and accommodation:
- Education Health Care Team moved to Tithe Barn Offices in Wellingborough.
- Emergency Planning colleagues moved to the Council offices in Thrapston, Cedar Drive.
- The Deprivation of Liberty Safeguards, Adults Brokerage, Adults Commissioning, Client Funds, Financial Assessments, Monitoring & Payments and Adult Social Care Management Team have moved to Haylock House in Kettering.

The Registration Service and Customer Call Centre have moved to Haylock House in Kettering. A number of colleagues will also work in line with the Council's Future Ways of Working strategy. To assist, some not-desking arrangements have been implemented in the offices to ensure that all staff get adequate time to work in the office and network with colleagues, which is really important for wellbeing.

COVID Additional Relief Fund

The Government has provided funds to give business rates relief for businesses impacted by COVID-19, but who are not eligible for existing relief schemes such as the Extended Retail Discount and Nursery Relief schemes. The deadline for making an application is Monday 13 June 2022 and all information can be found online.

Reminder: Birmingham 2022 Queen's Baton **Relay to visit Corby**

I just wanted to flag the exciting news, in case you missed the last edition of my Update, that the Birmingham 2022 Queen's Baton Relay is confirmed to visit Corby during its final journey through England this summer, as the full route is revealed.

Birmingham 2022 is hosting the 16th official Queen's Baton Relay – a journey which brings together and celebrates communities across the Commonwealth during the build up to the Games. In England, the Queen's Baton Relay will provide the opportunity for communities to experience the excitement for Birmingham 2022, as the 11 days of showstopping sport nears ever closer.

The Queen's Baton Relay is set to travel the length and breadth of England for a total of 29 days, before culminating at the Opening





Ceremony for Birmingham 2022 on 28 July 2022. It kicked off in London on Thursday 2 June, where it spent four days, coinciding with the

Queen's Platinum Jubilee Weekend. The baton will resume the international journey and then return to England on Monday 4 July to commence a 25-day tour of the regions.

On Sunday 10 July, Corby will officially welcome the baton. A busy schedule of activities and events is planned for the Queen's Baton Relay, with opportunities to highlight untold stories from 'Batonbearers' who are striving for change in their communities.

During its time in Corby, the Queen's Baton Relay will visit Corby East Midlands International Pool and experience exciting pool side displays from local divers and cheerleaders.


Scam Awareness Fortnight
