

East Northants Neighbourhood Team Locally Identified Priorities Survey Outcome April - July 2022

You said...we did...

As members of our local community in East Northants you voted on what you thought should be your locally identified priorities for the period between January and April 2022. As a result, Road Safety, Drug Misuse and Burglary were adopted as the priorities.

During this period, we have worked with Parish Councils, Town Councils, Highways, Housing Agencies, Neighbourhood Watch and other partner agencies in order to identify issues and concerns and subsequently tackle these.

Road Safety & Traffic Matters Policing Update:

- 21 tickets/summons/S59 warnings have been issued.
- Speed enforcement locations have been completed across the area including (but not exhaustive to) Wellingborough Road, Rushden; St Margaret's Avenue, Rushden; West Street, Oundle; Newton Road, Rushden; Kettering Road, Islip; London Road, Raunds; Stanwick Road, Raunds' Chelveston Road, Raunds, Brigstock; Bedford Road, Rushden; Woodford, Midland Road, Thrapston; Great Addington; Kings Cliffe; Cotterstock; Collyweston & Lutton.
- Over 40 intelligence logs have been submitted.
- School safety talks have been carried out at various Primary Schools.
- 2 vehicles have been seized
- 7 crimes have been recorded for dangerous driving/ driving whilst over the prescribed limit or with a dangerous load.
- 3 arrests for over the prescribed limit.

Vehicle Crime Update:

• Operation Tentacle – a dedicated operation set up to target vehicle crime within East Northants. Hotspot areas have been identified and targeted patrols have been conducted. Furthermore, crime prevention leaflets regarding motorcycle safety have been delivered to all identified owners of motorbikes within the hotspot locations.

- There have been 116 recorded vehicle crime offences including interfering with a motor vehicle, theft from a motor vehicle and theft of a motor vehicle. Of which there have been 38 reported theft of motor vehicles between April and July. The majority of which have been within Rushden, Higham Ferrers and Irthlingborough.
- 2 stolen motorbikes have been recovered in Rushden and a suspect has been identified for one of those recovered and investigation is ongoing. 1 male has been arrested for failing to appear in court over vehicle offences in Rushden and another nominal has been identified as being involved in theft from vehicles within the Rushden/Higham Ferrers/Irthlingborough area and investigation is ongoing in relation to this.
- Numerous intelligence logs have been submitted in relation to those involved in vehicle crime and officers are continually working hard to use ASB legislation alongside criminal offences to deter criminality and bring offenders to justice.
- Vehicle Crime Prevention Roadshows have taken place at Fermyn Woods Country Park, Fineshade Woods, Raunds Asda and Rushden Asda all with the Beat Bus.

Burglary Update:

- Every reported residential Burglary even just to an outbuilding has received a reassurance visit from a member of the team and a Burglary Prevention Pack issued to victim and immediate neighbours. There have been 39 reported residential burglaries including attempts between April & July all of these have been visited and signed up to receive Neighbourhood Alerts.
- Burglary Prevention Roadshows with the Beat Bus have been conducted in Collyweston and Stanwick Lakes.
- Burglary Prevention school talks have been completed at various schools in order to raise awareness of leaving doors unlocked etc.
- Proactive patrols of all hotspot areas for Burglary through high visibility foot patrols in order to deter suspicious activity.

We've discussed the findings with our local authority colleagues and other partners, and looked at local crime figures, and this has helped us identify three priorities that your local Neighbourhood officers will focus on over the next three months. For the East Northants area, the three local priorities from now until the end of November 2022, will be:

- Road Safety & Traffic Offences
- Burglary
- Drug Dealing & Drug Misuse
