The Volunteer Fair is a chance for local organisations to show what they do, in the hope that new volunteers, the lifeblood of such groups, can be signed up.




## **New Standard Bearers Named**





irst in a series dedicated to things that we perhaps take for granted, is a focus on two Selkirk High Street businesses dedicated to quality and service - Down To Earth Food and the Peony Rose Coffee House. Don't worry - we will be featuring the Jazrose (West Port) and 3 Hills (High Street) cafes in the future!

**The Peony Rose Coffee House** in the High Street opened under new ownership in January 2021. Unfortunately the second Covid lockdown happened, but Catherine Inglis managed to weather the storm, praising the help of her 'wonderful' staff and the loyalty of her customers.

The cafe has become a popular place for light lunches, teas and coffee, with a speciality of home-baked cakes and scones. Owner Catherine also uses local produce from the bakers, butchers and fruit shop. Open Monday to Saturday 9am to 4.30pm and Sundays 10am to 4.30pm, the cafe is a very friendly place to meet. Afternoon teas are also available from 2pm on Saturday and Sundays, and vouchers are available.



Andy Beatt set up **Down To Earth Foods** on Selkirk High Street in January 2013, with the aim of supplying the freshest and highest quality fruit, vegetables, whole foods and plants. Andy works hard to support local farmers by sourcing as much as possible of their fruit and vegetables locally, another benefit being the reduction in food miles travelled. Most of Down To Earth's potatoes come from within 15 miles, with a large proportion of vegetables sourced from the Scottish Borders, the Lothians, Fife and Northumberland. The emphasis as much possible is on local suppliers for soft fruit, some of which are grown just five minutes from Selkirk and picked on the day of sale.

Down To Earth supplies wholesale fresh fruit and vegetables to trade customers, and are proud to supply numerous businesses in Selkirk, Hawick, Galashiels and even further afield, including several butchers, schools, nursing and care-homes, as well as cafes, restaurants, pubs and hotels.



To things you didn't know you could get from Down To Earth include: Plants, Air mile-free tomatoes, Premium CBD Oils, Vegetable boxes, Artisan Bread, Pasta Sauces and San Marzano Tomatoes, Local and Rare Potatoes, Purple Carrots, Sweets, Jams & Local Honey and Recipes.

The visitors found time to squeeze in an authentic ceilidh experience, hosted by Selkirk Scottish Country Dance Club, at the Conservative Club, where everyone was encouraged to join in, from beginners to experts, and a lively time was enjoyed by all. But it didn't stop there: attractions enjoyed on trips to Edinburgh featured Edinburgh Castle (including the One o'clock Gun), the Camera Obscura and the National Museum of Scotland, plus a visit to the former Royal Yacht Britannia.

Back in Selkirk, an eventful week was rounded off by attendance at Appointment Night celebrations in the Market Place, followed by fish and chips and a 'Scotland Quiz' back at their hotel.



# **The Yarrow Stone Story**

Just off the A708 from Selkirk to Moffat rests the inscribed Yarrow Stone, marking the resting place of two Christian Princes who lived during the 5th or 6th Century AD. Uncovered around 1803, it features a Latin inscription, translatable as "This is the everlasting memorial. In this place lie the most famous princes Nudoss and Dumnogenos. In this tomb lie the two sons of Liberalis."





fter the end of Roman Britain, in the 5th Century AD, much of the Scottish Southern Uplands became part of the British kingdom of Strathclyde. The description panel beside the Yarrow Stone suggests that the memorial marks the fatal battle of Prince Nudd of the Damnoni (Strathclyde). Nudd ruled from about 575AD until around 600AD. it goes on to say that this fits with a confederate British campaign from 583 to 590AD, which retook all the territory occupied by the Angles, driving them back to their stronghold on the Northumbrian coast. The Yarrow battle may have been part of the victorious advance, but that is just speculation. What appears to be certain, however, is that the Angles regrouped and returned, decisively defeating a strong British force in 603AD, such that, by c.615AD the Yarrow area was completely under Angle occupation, with Selkirk an important centre.

## It Was 10 Years' Time Ago... Pringle Park




Children enjoying the playpark

The town's new £330,000 adventure park finally opened on Sunday 22nd June ten years ago at the **Pringle Park**. It took five years of fundraising by a small group of mums, and a further twelve months of planning and construction. Margret Sweetnam, Alison Cullen, Kerry Gentleman and Sheila Cochrane baked, walked, sold and campaigned in an effort to give their town the playpark it deserved. They raised over £330,000 since forming the group in 2008.

The new park would not have been possible without major additional support - £250,000 from the Big Lottery Fund's Community Spaces Scotland Fund, as well as £10,000 support from The Robertson Trust, £5,000 from Scottish Borders Council's Community Grants Scheme and Landfill Communities Fund of £35,000. They also received countless donations of money and precious time over the years from groups and individuals.
