# **Graham Coulson honoured**

#### Scout veteran recognised for service to the town

Graham Coulson was awarded an MBE in 2024 for his services to Scouting in Selkirk, and to mark the occasion the Community Council decided to present him with a certificate of recognition, on behalf of the town.

Graham works relentlessly and reliably, not just on behalf of the scouts, but also behind the scenes for other local groups, including organising the staging and catering. He is also an integral part of the Selkirk Musical Theatre Company and occasionally performs himself, sometimes as a comic duo in partnership with local actor and author John Nichol.

The award, created specially for the occasion by the Selkirk & District Community Council, was presented by Chair Andy Murray, at the talent-packed Scout's fundraising concert on December 28 at the Victoria Halls.

# Post Office Closure -SBHA open

The Post Office has advised that, following the resignation of the postmaster and the withdrawal of the premises for Post Office use, the **Selkirk Market Place branch closed on Tuesday 21** January

This doesn't mean that no-one has proposed taking over the business and Post Office, only that we don't know of anyone having done so yet.

In the meantime, there is another Post Office counter open from Monday to Friday: the branch situated in the **SBHA offices**, in **Whinfield Road, Riverside, TD7 5DT.** 

Hours are: Mon, Wed, Thurs: 09.00-17.15; Tues: 09.00-17.00, Fri: 09.00-15.45. Closed Sat & Sun.

Although the deadline for applications for a new Selkirk Sub-postmaster close on May 26th (!), discussions have started to explore the possibility of setting up a Banking Hub, as in Jedburgh.





Clothing manufacturers Lyle & Scott have taken over the former Lochcarron showroom on Dunsdale Road and transformed it into their own coffee shop and showroom, which is planned to open mid-March.

It is hoped that it will contribute to the continued development of Selkirk Riverside as a visitor destination.





#### Victoria Halls Notice Board Down

The Victoria Halls notice board blew over in the recent gales, smashing its perspex and rendering it irreparable. However, an alliance between the Flodden 500 group and the Community Council has already secured funding for a replacement, which should be installed soon.



## 5 x Plattling events in '25





elebrating the continuing friendship between Selkirk and the Bavarian town of Plattling, there will five groups of Plattling visitors coming our way in 2025.

The East Bavarian Highlanders will visit for a week at the end of April. They are a club of people (not exclusive to Plattling) who are interested in all things Scottish. Souters on a trip to Plattling encountered them at a music evening in Plattling, and they visited Selkirk for the first time in 2015. This year will be their 7th visit to Selkirk.

A week in mid-May will see the 11th visit to Selkirk for a Realschule group: a group of fourteen 13/14 year olds from the local secondary school accompanied by 2 teachers.

August sees a 12-person group under the leadership of Peter Lochmahr. Peter is the Chairman of STEPS, Plattling's twinning committee, and he has been directly involved in the Selkirk/Plattling partnership since its inception in 1998, bringing numerous groups to Selkirk in that time.

Dancer Heidi Koschollek will bring her group back to Selkirk in September for the third time, having already visited in 2019 and 2023. Heidi is a Plattling Town Councillor as well as leader of dance group Akhtar.

On a personal note, Angelika, from Heidi's dance group, stayed in the Haining's Dairy Cottage in 2023, with her 3 daughters, and for her third Selkirk trip, will be returning to Dairy Cottage for 12 nights.

Keen-eyed users of the Fleshmarket Steps will notice that the Plattling-Selkirk plaque, kindly donated to the town in 2023, has been mounted on the wall of the Post Office Sorting Office. The plaque, together with a historic Selkirk town sign, is close to the Plattling plaque at the bottom of the steps themselves.

# **Dog Mess Disgust**

recent upsurge in incidents of dog mess in Selkirk has provoked concern. Selkirk High School contacted the Community Council about possibly donating signs to deter dog owners from allowing their pets to create mess on the High School playing fields.

The Community Council agreed to fund the creation and installation of the signs, which were designed by High School pupils themselves. Two signs were installed on the 28th of January, and by the next day, one of them had already been pulled out of its concrete base and thrown on the ground. Undeterred, sign installers Advanced Signs of Galashiels returned to the site and reinstalled the fallen sign in a larger and more secure concrete base.

Echoing concern about the conduct of a minority of dog owners, residents have contacted the Community Council about dog mess, specifically in the Closes of the town, including Halliwell's Close, Bogie's Close and Doctor's Close. This of course makes a mockery of the recent completion of the Close painting, organised and paid for by the BIDS group.

There is no specific agency employed to clean these areas, but it should be reported straight away to the Council - see below. However, the Community Council was able to do some remedial work with the aid of a pressure washer, kindly enabled by Scottish Borders Council, and donated by the BCA group of North Lanarkshire.

This can only be a temporary solution; it is a change in behaviour that is required.

To that end, SBC Councillors have offered more signage and have reminded all of the existence of the **Dog Control Officer**, who can catch and fine persistent offenders if advised.

What if there are not any 'No Dog Fouling' signs in the area? The Dog Fouling (Scotland) Act 2003 covers almost all land open to the public with very few exceptions. Lack of signs is no defence if you are caught allowing your dog to foul and not removing the waste.

#### Do SBC still provide free dog poo bags?

SBC will not be providing free dog poo bags for the foreseeable future. These were previously provided as part of a partnership with Dogs Trust to promote responsible dog ownership.

I have seen someone not clean up after their dog. What can I do? You can **report it online** at https://www.scotborders.gov.uk/xfp/form/665 or phone 0300 100 1800.

SBC will require some details of the:

- Offender
- Dog
- Time and place the incident occurred

The more accurate and specific the information that is provided, the greater the chance that this will result in an offender being penalised.

#### **Morris Manson exhibition**

ocal Selkirk artist Morris Manson is known for his large geometric paintings. Morris attended Kingston upon Hull College of Art in the late sixties and afterwards found work as a potter with Aiden Dixon at the world-famous Wold Pottery near Beverley.

After two and a half years gaining experience he moved to the Isle of Skye with his wife Jane, founding Skyeramics Pottery at Dunvegan. In the 1990's the family settled in Selkirk, where Morris returned to his first love, painting.

His work is continually evolving and he finds great inspiration in the works of the Californian school, the hard edge painters and the multitudes of geometric artists working in South America. Morris makes works with sophisticated simplicity, and says: "I have great pleasure in just observing shapes/ marks for what they are".

Edinburgh Souters President May Stark welcomed everyone, including 2024 Royal Burgh Standard Bearer Mathew Stanners, Hon Provost Rodney Pow, New Ex-Standard Bearers Chairman Alasdair Craig, other members of the Selkirk Common Riding Trust and those who had travelled up from Selkirk.

Compere for the evening was Selkirk's John Nichol, who was in fine form, performing The Immortal Memory, Tam O' Shanter and other Burns works. The Haggis was addressed by Alan Elliott. There were recitals from Andrew Anderson and May Stark, and the musical entertainment was father and son duo Tommy and Darren Knox. The Vote of Thanks was given by Andrew Anderson. The evening was a fantastic success as the Society build up to their 100th anniversary in 2027. Over the years the Society have presented Gold Medallions to the Royal Burgh Standard Bearer each year and also have presented the Standard Bearer's Sash to the town.





Selkirk Rugby team's fine form in the Arnold Clark Scottish Premiership and the Border League has continued into 2025. At the time of writing Selkirk have won their last five Premiership games against Marr, Kelso, Melrose, Edinburgh Accies and Hawick. 
#### **General Store sets up Trading Post for clothes donations**
