
In addition, motorists parking too close to the Bleachfield Road Crossing Guard can restrict a clear view of pedestrians from oncoming drivers.



adly, a visitor recently suffered a fall on the slippery pavement outside the former Scoop premises in the Market Place, and had to be taken to the Borders General Hospital. The need to make the pavement safe was passed on to the Selkirk SBC Councillors and within two working days there was a Council team pressure washing the pavement. The team's opinion was that water overflowing from blocked gutters had lain on the pavement and generated slippery algae. The lesson is - gutters will need to be checked as we progress into Autumn. The Haining Update





he Trust, now on a sound financial footing, has so far invested **more than £1.5 million** in renovation and development of the estate. Improvements have included renovating the Coach House to create studios; renovating and furnishing two holiday flats and the Dairy Cottage; creating the Dandie Dinmont Museum and kennels; providing a network of accessible pathways and creating links to Selkirk town centre via the car park. As a result, the Haining attracts 3-500+ people per day, but more work is necessary.

When complete, the cultural and natural environment at the Haining, described as "A Place For Everyone", will include meeting and function spaces, a high quality cafe, artisan workshops and creative businesses, lochside and woodland walks, dedicated cycleways, and luxury camping and self-catering accommodation. An ambitious completion target of Spring / Summer 2024 has been set, but it is dependent on the estate raising the final amount to complete the work - estimated at £1.5m. Work includes complete rewiring, plumbing and central heating, rebuilding the internal walls and floors, construction of a new link building and a new all-year insulated marquee, plus provision of suitable toilets, disabled access and a new commercial catering kitchen. A new fund-raising programme has just been launched, and an **Open Meeting is planned for November 7th in the Victoria Halls**. For more information please go to www.thehaining.org

Selkirk CCTV Ahead of SBC

he Hawick Paper has reported that Selkirk, having taken the bull by the horns and set up our own CCTV system, has pre-empted decisions by Scottish Border Council, who are now planning to create a Borders-wide system.

The SBC system, however, has only been approved in principle, whereas Selkirk's is now operational and Hawick's is "80 % there in the planning stage."

Pointing out that SBC "might do it themselves again after ditching CCTV a few years ago", Hawick Community Councillor Cameron Knox is now asking Hawick representatives to meet SBC Chief Executive David Robertson to discuss plans.



Mr. Robertson is reported to want Hawick and six other towns' CCTV systems to be run and controlled by the local authority's Canada-based IT service provider CGI.



Burnside gallery's latest exhibition is its second presentation of elements from **The Art of the Illustrator**. It was felt to be appropriate to show them in October and November, since many of the illustrators served in the First World War.

The Art of the Illustrator was printed by the Press Art School, London, in about 1918, to interest and educate students. It shows the gradual development of one illustration for each artist, showing the illustrators' first sketches, mid point and final illustration.

This whole collection was owned by two artists, Maisie Murray and James Hutcheson, who donated it to the gallery. The collection is not for sale. Burnside gallery & frames is at 48 Market Place TD₇ 4BL, and the exhibition runs until 11 November, Wed – Sat, 10-1, and 2-4.30.



Local Books Recently Published


BERNAT KLEIN by Mary Schoeser & Alison Harley


Serbian-born designer **Bernat Klein** (1922 – 2014) immigrated to the UK in the post-war period and based his textile manufacturing business in the Scottish Borders from 1951 to 1992. In a career spanning six decades, Klein found international success in the interrelated spheres of fine art, fashion, textile design, architecture, industrial design, and colour consultancy. He sold couture fabrics to leading couturiers such as Chanel and Dior, gained recognition in Scandinavia and North America, and realised two important modernist buildings with architect **Peter Womersley** (1922 - 1993).

THE SEE-THROUGH HOUSE by Shelley Klein

Shelley Klein, daughter of Bernat Klein grew up in High Sunderland, close to Selkirk, a house planned by her father and designed by architect Peter Womersley. It was designed on a modernised open-plan grid; with colourful glass panels set against a forest of trees it was like living in a work of art.

When her father was in his 80s, Shelley moved back to High Sunderland to take care of him and she found that the house had not changed and neither had his uncompromising vision. "A book about the search for belonging and the pain of letting go, *The See-Through House* is a moving memoir of one man's distinctive way of looking at the world, told with tenderness, humour and a daughter's love".





PETER WOMERSLEY by Neil Jackson

Part of the series '20th Century Architects', *Peter Womersley* celebrates the life and work of architect **Peter Womersley** (1923 – 1993), who continuously pushed the frontiers of architectural design. Working from a small office in in Gattonside, he claimed a place on the world stage: nowhere was this more apparent than in the California-inspired High Sunderland, the 'see-through house' built for Bernat Klein.

Six of Womersley's buildings in Scotland and are listed, three at the top rate of Category A, while three of his four buildings in England are listed Grade 2. With plans and illustrations of all his buildings and projects, this new book is designed to draw attention to the significance of his work, placing it in its national and international context.
