

## **Protecting most vulnerable**

In August 2025 Police in the Scottish Borders attended and were involved with around 202 mental health related calls, around 31 missing person enquiries and approximately 91 domestic related incidents.

Selkirkshire had 27 mental health related calls and 1 missing person enquiry. Due to GDPR and protection of victims/subjects involved, we are unable to share any more specific information in relation to these type of call within this report.

Police Scotland work in collaboration with key partners to assist the most vulnerable within the communities and to provide support.



## **Reducing Violence and Anti-Social Behaviour**

#### **Anti-Social Behaviour**

On 07/08/2025 report of youths placing cones on the road, blocking it. Hillside Terrace, Selkirk. Road cleared and no trace of culprits. No criminality.

On 18/08/2025 report of vandalism to car. Selkirk Cricket Club, Selkirk. Enquiries ongoing.

On 21/08/2025 report of neighbour damaging fence. Taits Hill, Selkirk. Police attended, advice given.

On 21/08/2025 report of polythene on hay bales slashed. Linglie Farm, Selkirk. Ethical CR raised.

On 22/08/2025 report of window smashed at Selkirk High School, Selkirk. Suspects captured on CCTV however not identifiable.

## Theft by Housebreaking

#### Theft

On 04/08/2025 report of female stealing two bottles of alcohol. Spar, Selkirk. Culprit traced and charged.

On 05/08/2025 report of items stolen from motor vehicle. Glenburn Avenue, Newtown St Boswells. Enquiries ongoing.

On 11/08/2025 report of storage container broken into and construction equipment stolen. Tweed Horizons, Newtown St Boswells. All enquiries completed with negative result.

On 19/08/2025 report of theft of alcohol. Co-op, Selkirk. Enquiries ongoing. Culprit arrested, charged and held for court.

## **Tackling Serious and Organised Crime**

### Serious and organised crime enforcement - August 2025

The Scottish Borders CID Proactive Unit executed 3 Drug & General Evidence Warrants during the month of August which resulted in significant quantities of class B drugs recovered / weapons and stolen property.

A cannabis cultivation with value of £770,000 was found near Peebles.

Drugs with a value of £1000 plus cash and weapons were recovered in Jedburgh during a search.

A male was stopped and searched in the Galashiels area during a vehicle stop resulting in personal amounts of cannabis being recovered and the male failing a roadside drug swipe and reported for RTA offences.

#### **OFFICIAL**

General Evidence Warrants were executed in Edinburgh following the theft of high value bikes at Glentress resulting in a male suspect being reported for theft.

Four people were arrested, and eight people were reported for drug related offences during the month. These incidents were within Peebles, Galashiels and Jedburgh areas.

Proactive CID would like to re-enforce the message to all wards that any drug related crime or organised criminality in the Scottish Borders can be anonymously reported via CrimeStoppers, who are an independent charity not connected to the Police. The public can of course still use 101 for this purpose too.
