## **Welcome from the Chairman - Dorothy**

Many of you will know that the Parish Council purchased a piece of land adjacent to the playground off Bowling Green Lane. The aim is to restore the ancient pasture to encourage wildlife and wild flowers, creating a wildlife reserve.

We already have a baseline survey of birds in this habitat and intend carrying out an annual survey. Eventually we hope to erect a Hyde so people can view and identify the different species.

It is proposed to hold a meeting on site on Thursday 19th June at 10am so that local residents can come and discuss the plans. Anyone interested in this project can attend, perhaps your expertise will be valuable in making this project a success.

We look forward to seeing you, please wear stout footwear, we will meet at 10am near the fenced children's playground.

Our caretakers are working hard to keep Hunmanby looking its best. As the grass cutting season continues, we kindly ask residents to avoid parking on highway verges.

Parking on the grass prevents caretakers from cutting those areas and causes ruts and long term damage to the verges. Thank you for helping us maintain a tidy and attractive village.

## **Help Shape the Future of Our Community Centre**

The Parish Council owns the community centre building, while its day-to-day operations are managed by a dedicated committee of volunteers. Originally built as the village school, the building is now 120 years old — and with age comes the need for continual maintenance.

This month, we had to make the difficult decision to remove the bell tower due to an irreparable crack in the surrounding brickwork. With ongoing repairs and increasing maintenance costs, the Parish Council is now exploring an application to the Heritage Lottery Fund. Our goal is to extend, modernise, and preserve the building, ensuring it remains a valuable community asset for at least the next 50 years — while also making it more cost-effective to run.

As part of the funding process, we are asking residents to complete a short survey. Your feedback will play a crucial role in shaping the future of the community centre — from how it is currently used to what you'd like to see in the future. This is your chance to help guide the development of a key village resource for generations to come.

## **Monica Bridge**


It is with great sadness that we have to report that Monica Bridge, the Chair of Hunmanby in Bloom died on March 5th, after a short illness. Monica took over as Chair in 2016, when the group had many active volunteers and were still entering the Yorkshire in Bloom competition. This required a significant amount of work - preparing portfolios for the judges to read, helping to get the village planting looking good and taking the judges around on the day. In 2017 the group were also organising regular litter picks, an annual quiz/pie & pea supper, plant fair, Open Gardens, and a Michaelmas Fair. Monica and her husband John, who had 'retired' to the Old Station House were also very active in The Friends of Hunmanby Railway Station, promoting services and adding to its floral displays. Monica was always hard working, when not gardening or organising, she was making jams and chutneys for sale at Bloom fairs, or inviting volunteers to summer barbeques in her garden, and she did all this with a cheerful, positive manner. All groups, especially ones that have been around since 2004, decline as volunteers get older. Monica, with her light touch, allowed the group to change as circumstances demanded - no longer entering the In Bloom competition, but our focus remaining on keeping the village looking as good as we could. Hunmanby in Bloom is now a very small group and currently without a Chair. Monica will be sadly missed.
