"Cllr Phillips suggested that the parish council invite Hugh Smith (NYC – Major Projects Officer/Administrator of S106) to a public meeting. We need a strong business plan. Derek - How do we maximise the money we have available to us Land owner did a deal with the developer to ensure it was used where they want Need to put an amazing case together that we have listened to people Steve - Partnership working no joint conversation between different parties ASA been asking for quotes but nobody knew about it (10 years down, 3 to go before lost) Seems WA site is the best case for both pots of money Should get Hugh Smith, both parish councils, all sports groups, and other related groups. Peter Suggitt (there with Mick) has a letter from Hugh Smith - 12th July. He is not the decision maker - he just sits on the side He has to stick to the wording of the contract. Danny Football Foundation funding Pavilion grant - revamp grant (football or voluntary groups) FC could apply for EA pitch, ASA could apply for WA pitch ASA putting in quotes for windows and doors but don't want to hinder our ability to get match funding John Taylor - Cricket got requirements for storage, machinery, female changing areas Priority is cricket cage basketball WA courts - need resurfacing + hoops required Can easily fit two courts Getting prices for basket installation If using the school - only baskets will be required rise of 3-on-3 basketball (only half a court - 46sqft) 3 coaches and 13 players in the village. Main discussion list of project ideas were presented decided to officially

add outdoor gym to the list RP added walking/cycling infrastructure - quite possibly one for future (larger) pots. General opinion that some projects could be funded from other sources, which should be encouraged Arrangements for the next meeting: Speak to the school and confirm whether they can be involved from a community perspective Rob to talk to Tim (Finance Governor at EAPS) regarding their other 106 monies, whether they have it bring in advisors who may offer advice on what funding is available and best approach Sports Development Manager Hugh Smith Offer advice on how match funding can work and the potential for getting maximum benefit Suggest people present their progress on where they are with their projects."

- This revised planning application contains the same errors as used with the Pegasus development The parish
 council believe that NY Planning are not enforcing the previous issues raised by the parish with transport plan i.e
 inconsistencies of street scene.
- Road to the right-hand edge of the site doesn't go all the way to the edge (as if to connect through).
- Road to the right-hand edge doesn't appear to line up with that shown on the adjoining plot.
- There are no roads to the left-hand edge of the plot, indicating no intention to join up with that site.
- The street scene is still directly next to the road and does not seem to follow with adjoining sites.
- We ask that Highways and Planning should be leading on these matters with the developers, dictating what they expect to see i.e. site access, site linkups, street scene etc.
- We are supporting of the developments and want them to happen, but we have issues with planning comments previously made. We feel that we are reviewing every submission and making the same points.
