
## **Square Table Topper**

Finished size 18 inches approx



## You will need:

- Fabric A 70 cm white tone-on-tone (includes enough for backing and binding)
- Fabric B 8 inch x 10 inch piece coral
- Fabric C 8 inch square piece mid pink
- Fabric D 8 x 12 inch piece gold check
- A 20-inch square of wadding we used Thermolam

Sew with ¼ inch seam throughout

## To make the Quilt

- Fabric A cut one x 20 inch square for backing and 3 x 2½ inch strips across WOF for binding; cut one 9½ inch square for centre block and 48 x 2inch squares
- Fabric B cut 20 x 2 inch squares
- Fabric C cut 16 x 2 inch squares
- Fabric D cut 24 x 2 inch squares



Block 1 (Corner blocks) make four nine-patch units using fabrics A, B and D arranging colours as shown.

Make three horizontal rows of three squares, laying fabrics out as shown. Press seams away from white fabric. Sew the three rows together to form a block.

**Block 2** - make 8 units as shown, using fabrics A, B, C and D.


Make three horizontal rows as before and using layout shown left, pressing seams away from white fabric. Join the three horizontal rows together, nesting seams

Take two of the Block 2 units and join these together as shown left, rotating one block to the position shown. Stitch to one side of the 9½ inch centre patch.

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## Centre unit

Join a further two Block 2 units together and stitch to the other side of the 9½ centre patch, as shown. Press seams towards centre block.



Make a row with a Block 1 unit , 2 x Block 2 units and another Block 1 unit, laid out as shown left.

Make a second row as above. Stitch these two rows to the top and bottom of the centre unit, making sure to rotate the bottom row as per the diagram on the left.

Layer backing, wadding and quilt top together and spray baste or pin.

Sew the binding strips into one long strip, using mitre joins. Fold the strip in half lengthwise and press (double fold binding). Sew into place using your preferred method, mitring the corners and joining the binding using your preferred method.

Quilt as desired.
