


Wreath Quilt Pattern

Fabric and wadding requirements:

Note that requirements are based on 44-45 inch wide fabric.

Flower Fabric 1	One fat eighth
Flower Fabric 2	One fat eighth
Green fabric	One fat eighth (or 8 inch square)
Red fabric	One fat eighth
Background fabric	Half metre x width of fabric
Backing fabric	22 inch square
Wadding	22 inch square
Binding fabric	Quarter metre x width of fabric




Jewel Patchwork

Wreath Quilt Pattern



Finished size: 20½ inches square



All block measurements are in inches. Use quarter-inch seam throughout.

Cut fabric for wreath block as follows:

Background fabric:

Patch	Size	Number to cut
A	6½ x 2½	4
B	1½ x 1½	24
C	1⅞ x 1⅞	6 - cut in half along diagonal to make 12 patches
E	4½ x 2½	8
G	6½ x 6½	1
H	2½ x 2½	8

Join blocks 7, 8 and 9, pressing seams away from block 8.



Join the three rows together, nesting seams, as shown right, to reduce bulk.



Cut two strips 18½ inches by 1½ inches and attach to either side of wreath block. Press seams towards strips.


Cut two strips 20½ inches x 1½ inches and attach to top and bottom of block. Again, press the seams towards the strips.

Make a quilt sandwich by laying the square of backing fabric right-side down, place the wadding on top of this and then place the quilt block right-side facing up. Baste the layers together using your preferred method.

Quilt as desired and then trim the quilt sandwich to 20½ inches square.

Binding: Cut 3 x 2½ inch strips from WOF.


With right sides together, lay the short end of one strip on top of the other at right angles, pin and stitch (Fig A). Trim seam allowance to ¼ inch and press open (Fig B). Repeat joining strip 3 to strip 2.



Fold in half lengthwise to create your binding strip and press.

Attach the binding to the quilt, mitring the corners.


For blocks 4 and 6, make in the same way as 2 and 7 but press seams as shown in the diagram below.



Join blocks 1, 2 and 3 and press seams away from block 2



Join blocks 4, 5 and 6, pressing seams towards block 5




Red and Green fabrics

Patch	Size	Number to cut
B	1½ x 1½	16 red, 8 green
C	1⅞ x 1⅞	8 red, 2 green - cut in half along diagonal to make 16 red patches and 4 green patches

Floral fabric—two colours


Patch	Size	Number to cut
D	5¼ x 1½	8 of each colour
F	2½ x 1½	8 of each colour



To sew the flower units:


Note that the flowers are sewn with the longest patch at the top of the unit so flowers 1 & 9 are sewn in the same way, as are numbers 2 & 8, 3 & 7 and 4 & 6 — see diagram on previous page.

Referring to the diagram for placement of the colours, take patch C and sew to each end of patch D, stitching $\frac{1}{4}$ inch from diagonal edge as shown. Trim patch D back to match diagonal edge of patch C.




Press seams away from background fabric. Repeat for other side of flower unit.


Sew patch F to each end of patch H. Press seams away from centre patch.



Join top and bottom of flower patch units to the middle section. Press seams towards patch H. Make all flower units in the same way.



For blocks 1 and 9, join patch E to the left side and press the seam towards top and press seam towards patch A.



For blocks 3 and 7, join patch E to the right and press seam towards patch E, then join patch A to the top and press seam towards A.

For blocks 2 and 8, piece the side units from B patches and attach to either side of the flower unit. Press seams as shown.



Piece 2 of the following units from B and E patches. Press seams as shown.



Attach this unit to the bottom of block 2 and press seam away from flower unit. Do the same to make block 8.
