- 1141. Vice Chair Cllr Smith reported to Council that Chairman Cllr Auckland was current indisposed and would not be attending the meeting. Cllr Smith assumed the position Chairman of the meeting and brought the meeting to order.
- 1142. County Councillor Report –No written report received. Relevant information concerning types of VAS signs has been forwarded to the Chairman. It has been reported that he Midland Main Line electrification has now been pushed back and may now stop at Corby before reaching the Leicestershire stations of Market Harborough, Leicester, Loughborough and East Midlands Parkway. The Home Care Service has been reduced from 150 to 9, with 7 new, Care providers, leaving more than 400 vulnerable people with no service. Cllr Brighouse expressed that this is the worst time of year for this to happen. Cllr Smith asked Cllr Sprason if there was contribution available from LCC for reducing speeding within the Parish. Cllr Sprason to investigate possible match funding.
- 1143. Borough Councillor Report No written report received. Residents are encouraged to express their views on the community and crime by logging on to www.hinckley-bosworth.gov.uk/haveyoursay The land at the corner of 121 Station Road, Bagworth is being developed by Nottingham Housing Association and will now be 100% affordable housing and is likely to be approved by the Planning Department at H&BBC. Talks between the Nottingham Housing Association and the Bagworth Club regarding the land are being held. Councils and local groups are encouraged to apply for the Parish Initiative Grant fund which now gives a 60/40 grant.
- 1144. Questions from the Public An update regarding the land to the side of Thornton Primary School was requested. This is item 23 on the agenda and it was agreed to bring it forward on the agenda.

- 1145. Proposal to move item 23 Resolution on land to side of Thornton Primary School to item 4 on the agenda due to the interest of a member of the public present. **Resolution passed. Proposed by Clir Smith and seconded by Clir Brown.**
- 1146. Thornton Primary School have requested the use of waste land between the School and the allotments. Their proposal is to keep it as natural as possible and use it as an eco-garden for the pupils. Ownership has now been established as the Parish Council's. Permission to use the land was agreed and it was proposed to gift the land subject to solicitors fees. Proposed by Cllr Holt and seconded by Cllr Smith. Clerk to action and bring forward to next scheduled meeting.
- 1147. Apologies received Cllr Auckland. Resolved to accept, Proposed by Cllr Smith and seconded by Cllr Brown and by unanimous vote.
- 1148. To receive any declarations of pecuniary interest from members on any matter pertaining to the agenda None received.
- 1149. To receive and approve requests for dispensations from Members on matters in which they have a disclosable pecuniary interest None received.
- 1150. Minutes of the Parish Meeting held on Monday 3rd October 2016 at Thornton Community

The fixing of the signs to posts were discussed and moveable brackets were recommended. Police recommended that 2 x Bagworth and 2 x Thornton would suffice. Proposal to purchase 4 speed activated signs with rechargeable batteries and spare batteries was proposed with additional purchases up to maximum of precepted amount. Proposed by Clir Brighouse and seconded by Clir Holt. Passed by unanimous vote. Clir's Auckland and Smith and Clerk to action. Meeting to be arranged.

A further instalment of rent has been received from Pony Rescue Ltd together with the field rent income from Robert Miles.

No rents have yet been received in respect of Bagworth New Wood.

Budget 2016-17

The first draft has been completed and has been made available for members' attention. Members are reminded that the budget and hence the precept needs to be agreed by January and HBBC notified accordingly. It would appear from various sources that the government is still considering imposing capping on local councils and whether this materialises remains to be seen. Members may wish to bear this in mind when considering the precept and also that the Council is one of higher precepting councils in the county.

The draft budget throws up a number of issues most notably the existing provision for capital projects and which of these should be implemented in 2017-18 and whether any additional projects should be considered. Members need to bear in mind the council's limited capacity for undertaking a number of substantial projects at the same time.

I think the best approach would be to do as we have done in the past and to convene a finance committee meeting to make recommendations to the Council and to agree budgetary provisions especially with regards to capital projects and ongoing maintenance costs in regard to Bagworth New Wood. Existing reserves need to be reviewed and the Council should consider whether it still wishes to proceed with the proposed expenditure. Expenditure, other than play equipment, is projected to take place in 2017-18 although it is possible that it could be made in 2016-17. Projected expenditure consists of:

The cost of speed detection cameras etc and Maynard Park fencing originally were to be wholly funded by \$106 drawdowns. The playground equipment reserve is intended to be utilised at some future unspecified date and the reserve is intended to ensure funds are available when needed. It ought to be possible to firm up on the pavilion proposals by the precept submission deadline.
