CABINET 1.3.22

To approve the Powys Nature Recovery Action Plan – the purpose and aim is to reverse the decline in bio diversity by focusing on developing a resilient ecological network via the PNRAP. Working in partnership with stakeholder to identify local priorities to contribute to the delivery of the national objectives.

To approve the Climate Change Strategy – the authority declared a climate emergency in Sept 2020 and we face a serious challenge to meet 0% emissions by 2030. To have focused engagement with stakeholders, farmers, local food producers to reduce food miles. To consider the local procurement strategy which links into the Economic Strategy.

To approve a Welsh Adoption and Fostering collaborative arrangement and this will provide a follow through from fostering into adoption with the same group of officers overseeing the board.

To approve the Regional Partnership Board Agreement for April 22 – March 26. A formalised agreement of Powys County Council, Powys Teaching Health Board and Powys Assoc of Voluntary Organisation to effectively carry out statutory duties.

CABINET 8.3.22

The cabinet resolved to close Llanbedr C in W School with effect from 31.8.22.

To approve Sennybridge Strategic Outline Case for a new 150 space dual stream new primary school to be submitted to Welsh Government for approval.

To note the ongoing Llanfyllin area school transformation programme.

To note North Powys Health Care Provision on a site in Newtown incorporating Powys CC, Powys Teaching Health Board/ Education and Social Services Department.

To approve the Housing Revenue Account – 30 year plan incorporating new builds, compliance, welsh housing quality standards. 509 new homes to be built in next 5 years.

To note the Housing Tenancy Survey – with an outcome of 71% overall satisfaction including neighbourhood, quality, repairs and maintenance.

Motion to look at providing greater support for food and fuel poverty was passed. Motion to delay education transformation by 1 year was defeated.

NORTH POWYS WELLBEING HUB

A new state of the art health and wellbeing campus in Newtown has taken a significant step forward following endorsement from Welsh Government. A Programme Business Case (PBC) had earlier been submitted to Welsh Government by the North Powys Wellbeing (NPWB) Programme highlighting the benefits of bringing together health and wellbeing services onto a single site adjacent to Park Street in Newtown. Endorsement for this business case was announced by First Minister Mark Drakeford MS in the Senedd on 15.3.22.
