A serious offence is in progress or has just been committed

Someone is in immediate danger or harm

Property is in danger of being damaged

A serious disruption to the public is likely

If you are deaf or hard of hearing, use our textphone service 18000

Or text us on 999 if you have pre-registered with the [emergencySMS service](#)

Silent 999

If you are in danger but can't talk on the phone, you should still call 999 and follow these instructions:

Calling from a mobile:

If you don't speak or answer questions, **press 55** when prompted and your call will be transferred to the police.

Pressing 55 only works on mobiles and doesn't allow the police to track your location.

If you don't press 55 your call will be ended.

Calling from a Landline:

If you don't speak or answer questions and the operator can only hear background
