Annual Report 2024/25

There have been 7 meetings this year, with good attendance from Councillors.

The chair during this time was Cllr. Alwyn Nutting and vice chair was Cllr. Graham Green. We saw County Councillor Heulwen Hulme retire and County Councillor John Yeomans was elected.

During this time 4 planning applications have been discussed. A meeting at the start of the year was attended by 2 local PCSOs who gave a talk on Crime Prevention, with a question-and-answer session, this was open to all residents to attend.

A total of £1400.00 has been donated to local causes, this includes £200 to Alzheimer's, £200 to Wales Air Ambulance. £1000 was donated to ACA, this was used to set and pay for free WIFI at the Community Centre.

At the latest budget meeting the precept was set for 2025/26 was set and has remained unchanged for the last 2 years.

Pot holes continue to be an issue in the area.
