

The two anthems were played, this time by Gwyneth Jones on the piano, and we all sang with gusto.





COMMUNITY COUNCIL ELECTION & AGM

At the recent elections, current Community Councillors were uncontested and so a full election was not held. The election for the County Councillor was held and County Councillor Heulwen Hulme was re-elected.

At the Community Council 2022 AGM, current Chair Cllr. Nigel Hamer stood down after holding the post for the last 5 years. Cllr. Alwyn Nutting was elected as Chair and Vice Chair Cllr. Graham Green. It was decided at the AGM to donate £100 towards the Platinum Jubilee celebrations being held at the Community Centre.

ANNUAL REPORT: 18th May 2022

Since the 2021 AGM there have been four online meetings and six face to face meetings, with good attendance from all Councillors.

The chair during 2021-22 period was Cllr. Nigel Hamer and vice chair Cllr. Alwyn Nutting. Sian Griffiths continues as the Internal Auditor, and recently completed the 2021-22 audit.

The speed review within Aberhafesp village is still ongoing with progress of a Speed Indicator Device sign to be purchased very soon. Traffic monitoring strips have been placed for two weeks, to compare the results from the last time it was monitored.

We continue as a community Council to oppose all section 106 removals, from local needs housing within the area.

COMMUNITY COUNCIL

Aberhafesp Community Council covers the area of Aberhafesp, Bwlch-y-Fridd, Bethel and Rhyd-y-Felin.

A Community Council is governed by the Local Government Act of 1972. Here in Aberhafesp it consists of seven Councillors who sign a Declaration of Office and work on a voluntary basis for the good of the whole community. They are supported by a clerk who is employed to ensure the correct procedures are enforced and the smooth running of the Council in general.

Meetings are held on a **Wednesday evening in the Community centre,** and members of the public can attend any meeting, unless otherwise specified.

Notice of each meeting

is displayed for three clear days giving the date, the time, and the agenda. They are posted on the notice boards at Bwlch-y-Ffridd, Hillcrest

Aberhafesp, the Community Centre and the telephone kiosk in Bethel. Details of meetings can also be found on the

Community Council <u>Facebook page</u> and the **Community Council** <u>website</u>

You can access the latest *County Councillor monthly reports* as well as current *County planning applications*, where you can enter comments to support or object.

The decisions made at a meeting and also the attendees are posted on the website within a week of a meeting. The full minutes of meetings are only posted on the website after they have been approved by the Community Council which takes place at the start of the following meeting. For example minutes from a meeting in July would be approved in August, if a meeting was held then.

If you have an item you wish to add to the agenda please contact the clerk Rachel Hamer <u>rachel.hamer72@hotmail.com</u>. Come and just watch if you have an interest in anything on the agenda, or if you have anything you wish to bring to the attention of the council and you wish to speak at the meeting you need to ask the chairman.
