FINANCE ALERT

This winter we shall need your support more than ever. Due to the pandemic, we have had far less going on in the hall than usual, and consequently have had far less income. As a charity, the only income for the hall's upkeep has to be made by our own efforts, apart from donations from the community council, and occasional private contributions. Joan Michel has been marvellous at getting grants for us, both during and after the pandemic, which have been instrumental in keeping us going, and keeping an emergency fund.

The fuel expenses will be greater this winter and £2000 plus worth of oil has just been put into the tank. The electricity bill is expected to be large. The annual insurance bill is £1500, and we have various essential annual inspections, which cost money, such as P.A.T. testing for all the electrical equipment, fire alarms and emergency lighting, equipment for putting out fires etc. We are responsible for all repairs needed at the hall which is why we have to keep our emergency funds. We have been able to donate a great deal to other charities in the past, but sadly for now this will not be possible.

COMMUNITY COUNCIL

Aberhafesp Community Council covers the area of Aberhafesp, Bwlch-y-Fridd, Bethel and Rhyd-y-Felin.

A Community Council is governed by the Local Government Act of 1972. Here in Aberhafesp it consists of seven Councillors who sign a Declaration of Office and work on a voluntary basis for the good of the whole community. They are supported by a clerk who is employed to ensure the correct procedures are enforced and the smooth running of the Council in general.

Meetings are held on a **Wednesday evening in the Community centre,** and members of the public can attend any meeting, unless otherwise specified.

Notice of each meeting

is displayed for three clear days giving the date, the time, and the agenda. They are posted on the notice boards at Bwlch-y-Ffridd, Hillcrest

Aberhafesp, the Community Centre and the telephone kiosk in Bethel. Details of meetings can also be found on the

Community Council <u>Facebook page</u> and the Community Council <u>website</u>

You can access the latest *County Councillor monthly reports* as well as current *County planning applications*, where you can enter comments to support or object.

The decisions made at a meeting and also the attendees are posted on the website within a week of a meeting. The full minutes of meetings are only posted on the website after they have been approved by the Community Council which takes place at the start of the following meeting. For example minutes from a meeting in July would be approved in August, if a meeting was held then.

If you have an item you wish to add to the agenda please contact the clerk Rachel Hamer <u>rachel.hamer72@hotmail.com</u>. 15 minutes at the beginning of each meeting is allocated for members of the public to ask questions or comment on anything on the agenda. Please contact the clerk with any questions before the meeting so that an answer can be prepared, otherwise we may not be able to give an answer until the following meeting. Come and just watch if you have an interest in anything on the agenda, or if you have anything you wish to bring to the attention of the council.
