Welcome to the Autumn/Winter edition of the Community Newsletter! Apologies to everyone for the delay - the preparations for the Winterfest event required a lot of time and some other projects have been on hold for a while. However, we made it and Winterfest is over for now.... so here we are with our updates and news!

FITNESS ROOM:

It was originally intended to create a new fitness suite in the Community Centre. An application for funding for this was made earlier this year but we heard only recently this has been unsuccessful. However, the prospect of making use of the vacated Police Station has arisen and this is now being explored.

Subsequent discussion with the Hall Committee on the matter has seen the project being put on hold, for reasons as yet unknown.

Yet another opportunity for a fitness centre located over at the Ferrycroft site has come up, albeit at least 2 years away, as part of the envisaged Sailing Club development, a feasibility study for which is about to be undertaken.

At this stage it is worthwhile, given the three options available, to consult with the whole community (with the help of HIE) to seek your views on the most appropriate location for a fitness centre. This should cover:

- the practicality of the Community Hall to accommodate more facilities
- the potential advantages of the Police Station to offer space for other uses and what these might be
- the risk of waiting and depending upon delivery of the Ferrycroft/Sailing Club development

Once we receive more information on all three fronts we will confirm the details of the community consultation.

We now turn our attention to the next stage which is to secure funding for installation.



CAPLICH WIND FARM DEVELOPMENT FUND SET TO DELIVER LOCAL SKILLS OPPORTUNITIES

The company proposing the 20-turbine Caplich Wind Farm, situated 5 km north of Oykel Bridge, has announced £8000 in funding to invest in the delivery of skills and training opportunities locally. Muirhall Energy, an independent Scottish

developer, has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Lairg and District Learning Centre to deliver the funding to cover the Community Council areas of Creich, Ardgay and Lairg. This will be invested over a six-month period from December 2015.

The Caplich Skills Fund will deliver a variety of courses, including chainsaw training and First Aid training, but the Lairg Learning Centre is open to suggestions from the community as to further uses.

The funding is on top of the proposed community benefit funding, amounting £340.000 annually (£8.5m over the 25-year period), to be shared with the five community council areas local to it should the windfarm receive consent.



CHURCH HILL PATH

In October LDCI and members of the local community spend a Saturday cleaning the path and the woodland so the Hill looked smart for Remembrance Sunday and is ready for use in the winter months ahead. *Light up Lairg* set up some beautiful lights on the Hill side and when the snow comes it will look truly Christmassy.

We hope to continue this work ton a regular basis hroughout the coming year and new volunteers are always welcome.

Dates for the volunteer days will be announced on Lairg Sutherland Facebook page and the Spring edition of our Newsletter. Please join us if you have time to spare. It is great fun and lots of fresh air.

LDCI have re-applied for funding for upgrading the path and we are awaiting a decision in the New Year. Let's hope we'll be successful this time.



Ferrycroft Visitors Centre
