Ferrycroft Visitor Centre

In partnership with Highland Council and Visit Scotland, LDCI has been successfully operating Ferrycroft Visitor Centre since May 2010.

During this time LDCI recognised that the facilities at the Visitor Centre would need to be developed to maintain the sustainability of this community enterprise.

The decision by Highland Council to reorganise many of their recreational and leisure facilities to be run by an arms-length company prompted LDCI to consider the future of Ferrycroft Visitor Centre for the community.

A community consultation was carried out in July 2011 where every household in Lairg was invited to express their opinion on the future of Ferrycroft and its long term development.

The results of the consultation indicated that the community were in agreement with LDCI acquiring and developing the centre for the benefit of the community.



Based on feedback from the consultation, funding was secured to appoint an architect and quantity surveyor. Plans were drawn up to extend and enhance the existing facilities to cater for visitors to Ferrycroft. This in turn will create a number of new employment opportunities within the community. A feasibility study using this information has formed the basis of a five year business plan. A number of other suggestions were made including: Local Crafts Could Be Expanded - Ferrycroft acts as a retail outlet for local arts and crafts and provides an income for producers.

Play Facilities Need To Be Upgraded – LDCI is currently trying to secure the £14,000 required to replace the Cable Ride.

Update The Exhibitions – LDCI is working with SSE to provide a new exhibition.

LDCI is aware of the importance of retaining Ferrycroft as a visitor attraction, information point and most importantly, seasonal employment provider.

Lairg Eco Croft

The idea for the Lairg Eco Croft was conceived in 2009 and the concept has been gradually developed into a working business plan.

Foundations of the Eco Croft plan have already been achieved by LDCI by providing a community hub at Ferrycroft for local producers to sell arts and crafts.

Due to the condition of the land a sensitive approach to its management has been identified and the development will be based on the principals of permaculture.

LDCI aims to access funding during early 2013 and start working on the site in late summer/early autumn.
