# LOCH SHIN SAILING CLUB

Loch Shin Shin Sailing Club is delighted to have been selected to go through to the next round of the 2014 Commonwealth Legacy Fund.



From over 90 applicants from all over Scotland, LSSC' s application has been given the initial funding of £25,000 to be spent on scoping work for our project. This money will be spent on feasibility and marketing studies together with preparing plans to build a sailing centre and bunkhouse on land leased to us by LDCI on the eco-croft site at Ferry-croft.

After this fairly lengthy process we then hope to have a credible bid in place to attract funding in order for the facility to be built.

The proposed complex will, we hope, include a sauna and jacuzzi available for public use.

We will be consulting fully with the community throughout the process and plan a public presentation at a later date when the details are clearer.

Our aim is to create a sustainable social enterprise in Lairg, providing long-term employment and attracting visitors to the village, adding to the prosperity of existing local businesses.

#### LAIRG LEARNING CENTRE

Last year the Learning Centre celebrated its 10th anniversary last year and apart from its usual range of recreational and academic classes, it ran a range of successful projects. The Lottery funded WW1 project, 'Reading Between the Lines' had over 100 people attend classes and workshops, with over 150 community members visiting the photographic exhibition and youth film premiere in Ferrycroft. Over 100 people attended the drama, staged in the community centre, with 50 people involved in writing the scripts, acting on stage and helping behind the scenes. An archive of WW1 memorabilia was also gathered by the community and has been donated to the History Society. An app was also made, in conjunction with the primary school, and that will be launched in the Spring.

The 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations continued, with a fun day where people could try spinning, sewing, art, IT and watch a range of demonstrations. Two competitions were launched, for creative writing and art, and the winners ended up coming from the same household, John and Sonia Bidwell from Rosehall. Over 50 people helped make the water feature for the garden, which will be unveiled by the charity in the Spring.

A whole range of classes are running currently and will finish at Easter, such as a craft class for kids, sewing, patchwork, poetry, creative writing, basic Word, Business IT training and Work Clubs for the unemployed. Our business classes stay popular, with free workshops, as well as Emergency First Aid in the workplace and Food & Hygiene courses, which can be funded through ILAs, making them free to students.

The new Spring prospectus will be out by the end of March and features new classes, such as An introduction to Psychology, Dolls House and shadow box making, ECDL (computing qualification) and a book club for kids, as well as popular classes in sewing, patchwork, I.T. and writing. A variety of workshops will also be on offer, such as silk painting, cake decorating, leather working and sewing. We are working in conjunction with Greening Kyle to run a gardening class, the cost being subsidised by Greening Kyle if people attend their event in Bonar Bridge on the 4<sup>th</sup> April.

A recent success is the new computer maintenance classes, taught by Ryan Connelly, which filled within a couple of days, so a second class was arranged. There is a waiting list for a third! Ryan has volunteered in the Centre for many years, and is now receiving tutor training so that he can become a regular teacher for the Centre, and his classes are delighted by what they have learnt.
