



## **BUREAU EXPANDS SERVICE**

ECSCAB has expanded its service across Sutherland with the return of the daily drop-in service in Golspie and by adding further outreach clinics in Brora, Helmsdale and Lairg.

We are now open 9 - 5 Monday to Friday in Golspie and have drop-in advice clinics:

Brora Library - Monday 2 – 4
Helmsdale Community Centre – Tuesday 9.30 – 10.30
Dornoch Hub - Wednesday 10 – 12
Lairg Community Centre - Thursday 9.30 – 10.30
Bonar Bridge Hub – Thursday 11.00 – 1.00.



We have lots of new learning activities coming up this month including some spooky themed activities for Hallowe'en. Thanks to funding from The Highland Council's Sutherland Cares fund we were also able to run free Family Art Sessions during the October Holidays!

We are delighted to have Heather Bruce from The Rusty Coo running workshops exploring paper cutting and what you can do with a Cricut Machine.

We'll be a special Micro Film Festival screening the Highlands & Islands Climate Hub Film, The Dreaming Bog and microfilms made by participants of our Through The Lens Smartphone Filmmaking Workshops with Robert Aitken.

October brings with it the Scottish Mental Health Arts Festival Highland. At Lairg & District Learning Centre we recognise the importance of participation in arts activities and how this can support mental health & wellbeing. All of the learning activities we deliver aim to support the mental health and wellbeing of our communities by providing a safe space to learn new skills, share skills and connect with others.

This month we also see another term of Mini Makers (our crafty after school club for P4-P7), Cook Together Family Cooking Sessions and Bake and Blether at Lairg Community Centre.

We're also launching a Woodworking Maker Space from the 31st October Our Cabin Sessions are open to anyone 16+ interested in woodworking who'd like to come along to use our space, our equipment and meet others with similar interests. You can bring any projects you're working on and our tutor Graham will be on hand to support sessions and answer any questions.

The Highland Community Waste Partnership (HCWP) is a community-led collaboration working to reduce waste and build a movement for more sustainable consumption in the Highlands. Launched in April 2022 and funded by The National Lottery Climate Action Fund until April 2025, we are working to raise awareness, promote more circular services and skills, trial interventions and share learning across three key areas of waste









The initiative coordinated by Keep Scotland Beautiful is led and implemented by eight community organisations across the Highlands; Broadford & Strath Community Company, Highland Good Food Partnership, Lairg & District Learning Centre, Lochaber Environmental Group, Transition Black Isle, Ullapool Community Trust, Velocity Café and Thurso Community Development Trust.

Each partner has different areas of interest, experience and expertise. Over the past year Lairg & District Learning Centre have carried out the following projects and activities as part of the partnership:-

- We've developed and delivered a series of workshops focused on reusing and recycling thrift flip, woodwork, foraging and composting - working with locally available tutors to provide learning experiences that lead to a more sustainable future.
- We've created a regular Maker Space drop-in session focused on bringing people together
  in a safe space to tackle loneliness & social isolation as well as reducing textile waste by
  nurturing skills and talent of local people to pass on skills in sewing, mending, crafting etc.
- Developed a programme of ECO Classes interacting with people and showing them how
  to do something with the resources you have to reduce single use items face pads,
  kitchen roll, food coverings, tote bags, felted soap.
- Tackling Rural Plastics through bunting making workshops using old Feed Sacks
- Forming connections in the communities around us exploring ways of working with them on behaviour change.
- Attending the local community market on a monthly basis to promote the work of the HCWP and different workshops focused on behaviour change.
- Bringing creative recycling solutions to local initiatives and events e.g. making a Poppy Cascade for the War Memorial Centenary out of second hand wool and deer netting off cuts in partnership with Lairg & District Community Initiatives.
- Hosted Climate film screenings and Swish clothes swap events!

LDLC have hosted 113 events & activities in the first year of the HCWP! Thank you to everyone who attended or helped us run these sessions! We could not do this amount of learning without you! Coming up we have some online classes over the winter, more in person workshops and have another clothes swap planned with a crafty de-stash on the 11th November. So, please dig out your pre-loved clothes or crafty items or just come along for a cuppa and a chat.

Lochview rural Training has had a very busy summer with a range of education sessions for both youths and adults.

Our junior crofters remains busy with youths aged 7-11 attending fortnightly on a Saturday morning - activities range from feeding the animals, looking after the polytunnel and playing games. Our young crofters for 12-19 year olds meet on a Friday afternoon, as part of the sessions they learn more about the skills required for entering the land based sector, sessions include all aspects of crofting from care of the livestock to land maintenance. The sessions are great for intergenerational work also as we often have the young crofters volunteering at large crofting community events including, shearing, sorting of lambs and sheep for the sales, Dipping and scanning. These occasions help the youths build up their Saltire Award volunteer hours.

Our Tuesday Fresh Roots program is a dedicated session for adults that like to be outside and learning about local produce but also wanting to improve their own wellbeing. The sessions often mix creativity and wellbeing, over the last few weeks they have been making Rowen jelly and apple butter. We aim to produce a small recipe book

Our employability program also continues to be busy and we are delighted to be taking one young person on as a paid placement for 6 months.
