FROM VISION TO REALITY: 'FLIGHT PATH' COMPLETION




If you've had a chance to check our social media, you might

SCAA - Friendship Club Talk

On Tuesday, 20th May, Michael Hanratty from Scotland's Air Ambulance Charity (SCAA) visited Lairg Community Centre to speak to the Friendship Club about the charity's lifesaving work.

SCAA is Scotland's only charity air ambulance, responding to serious accidents and medical emergencies across the country. Their skilled paramedics and pilots operate two helicopters and rapid response vehicles from bases in Perth and Aberdeen. This service is especially important in remote areas like Lairg, where fast medical care during the critical "Golden Hour" can mean the difference between life and death.

Michael explained that his fundraising involvement began after the air ambulance saved his niece's life. The Friendship Club members enjoyed the talk and raised generous donations. Michael later visited Lairg Primary School to share more about SCAA's work. For more information, visit:








The Radio Teleswitch Service (RTS) switch-off is scheduled for June 30, 2025. This will affect households that use older electricity meters to heat their homes and hot water

Why is RTS being switched off?





 RTS was introduced in the 1980s and has reached the end of its natural operational life.

What will happen if my RTS meter is switched off?

Your heating and hot water supply may stop functioning as normal.

What can I do?

Contact your electricity supplier to find out if your meter needs replacing. If you think your meter might use the RTS, speak to your landlord. Ask your landlord to find out whether your meter uses the RTS and to contact the energy supplier if it does.

What will replace RTS meters?

RTS and DTS meters are being replaced with smart meters. Smart meters work in the same way as your meter does now.
