Victory over Japan Day (VJ Day), celebrated on 15th August 1945, marked the official end of World War II after Japan announced its surrender to Allied forces. This date is recognised for bringing the six-year war to a complete end, though the official surrender documents were signed on September 2, 1945.

A lone piper stood at dawn in Edinburgh to mark the 80th anniversary on 15th August 2025. The conflict profoundly impacted Scotland, with regiments like the Gordon Highlanders and the Royal Scots serving in the Far East, suffering heavy casualties from 1941 to 1945.

Local Lairg residents came out in force to honour lives lost during the conflict.

BOOK OF TALES FROM THE FORECASTLE Hiroshima Remembered by Jonathan Brett Young



The recent 80th anniversary of the dropping of an atomic bomb on Hiroshima reminded me of an incident that occurred many years ago at our Guest House.

In the mid-1980s, a middle-aged Japanese gentleman and his daughter stayed with us for one night. And then moved on. But I remember three things about their visit.

When they had settled in and we were talking, I asked him, as I always do, where he had come from that day. A usual reply is Inverness or Edinburgh. Or even London. But he astonished me. "New York", he said.

I then asked him where he and his daughter were from. "Japan", he answered. "Whereabouts in Japan do you come from?" I asked. I had visited Japan many times years ago. "Hiroshima", he said.

"Were you there in 1945?" I asked. He said "Yes".

I became inquisitive. "Were you there when the bomb was dropped?" He again said "Yes". He saw my interest and explained that he was within 2000 yards of Ground Zero but had been in a deep shelter and survived. I noted that he had his daughter with him, but did not pursue that avenue of conversation.

The following morning after breakfast when they drove off in their large hired Mercedes-Benz I noticed a new shiny Mercedes-Benz hubcap lying in the drive.

Today, many years later, that same hubcap is Arkle's dish. Very upmarket. Very Cavalier King Charles Spanielish.

Needless to say, it is an object to which he is very attached.



Friday 15th August, was VJ Day, and Lairg held a service followed by an afternoon tea at the Church Hill shelter.

We were delighted to welcome several family members who joined us for the afternoon. Their grandfathers and great-grandfathers not only fought in the Far East, but were also captured and held as prisoners of war in Japanese camps across Burma and the region for the remainder of the conflict.

The Lairg Lunch Club has just started back up again after taking a break over the summer holidays. We are delighted to announce that we have received £1464 from the W G Edwards Charitable Foundation which will go towards funding both the Lunch Club and the Friendship Club over the next year.

The club meets once a week on a Thursday during the school term time at the Lairg Community Centre.

Members receive a hot three-course meal which has been cooked by the Lairg Primary School Canteen and served by Lunch Club volunteers.

LDCI supplies an accessible minibus which picks the members up from their homes and brings them to Lunch Club and then takes them home afterwards.

Lunch Club members pay £5 every week and £6 per term – these fees go towards the costs of running the club and towards a Christmas meal in a restaurant (as well as a summer outing).

Why not ask our traders if they would consider making you a commission piece, something entirely original and special?











