# Scottish Silence: Honouring the Fallen

Remembrance Sunday is held on the second Sunday in November every year throughout the United Kingdom, including Scotland.

For the year 2025, Remembrance Sunday will be on Sunday, 9<sup>th</sup> November. It is always the Sunday closest to Armistice Day, which is observed on 11<sup>th</sup> November - the date the fighting of the First World War formally ended at 11am in 1918.

#### Why Do We Honour Remembrance Sunday?

Remembrance Sunday is a national day of commemoration in Scotland and the UK for the armed forces and civilians who have died in the two World Wars and subsequent conflicts. A two-minute silence is observed at 11am, to allow the nation to pause, reflect on the cost of war, and appreciate the peace and freedoms enjoyed today.

It is typically marked by the laying of poppy wreaths at war memorials and cenotaphs across Scottish cities, towns, and villages.

The Poppy Appeal is closely linked to the annual Poppy Appeal run by Poppy Scotland (the Scottish branch of the Royal British Legion). The money raised supports veterans, current service personnel, and their families. See page 8 for local services.



# **Unveiling of Lairg Painting**

On the afternoon of Friday, 24 October, folks gathered at the Ferrycroft Visitor Centre, where former LLHS chairperson, Marlyn Price unveiled a beautiful painting of Lairg, before the dam was built. "Loch Shin from View Hill" was created by Andrew Sutherland, fondly remembered as Andrew the Barber.

Born in Dornoch, Andrew later moved with his family to Balcharn. He and his wife, Madge, made their home on Churchill Road.

A photograph shows Andrew standing beside his garage door, which he had decorated with a painting of Loch Shin looking toward the Free Church. His house once stood at the entrance to Sutherland Way, though it no longer exists today.

The painting was generously donated by former Lairg resident William Sutherland, who now lives in Spain. Wanting the painting to return to the people of Lairg, William entrusted it to LLHS, and the society is honoured to preserve it for the community.

#### Painting of Lairg Dam by Alexander Clyne

Lairg resident Martin Clyne proudly owns a beautiful painting of the new Lairg Dam, created by his grandfather, Alexander Clyne. A copy of this artwork also hangs in the Ferrycroft Visitor Centre. Martin shares the story behind it:

This painting was made by a worker on the Lairg Dam in 1955. The artist, Mr. Alexander Clyne

(born 1909), was a builder, architect, and civil engineer.

While working on the dam, he constructed scale models of the sluice gates to help interpret the blueprints accurately and assist the builders.

The painting was later featured in the 1955/56 Wimpey Construction Company calendar and sent to Wimpey headquarters. Sadly, Alexander passed away on 9 March 1956 after suffering a heart attack while working on the upper dam at Lairg. He was taken in by a local family, who gave him water and comforted him in his final moments.

# The Lairg Helping Hand Fund



As the nights draw in and the seasons change, many of us find ourselves needing to keep the heating on for longer. With the cost of living at its highest level for a decade, and the average annual energy bill rising by 2% on the 1<sup>st</sup> October, it is possible that some of you might be having to make the difficult decision between choosing to keep food on the table or heating your homes. If this is the case for you – LDCI would like to remind you about the Lairg Helping Hand Fund which aims to provide a one-off grant to households who are struggling financially. Since 2020, the fund has supported 66 households in the local area with heating or energy costs.



Lairg & District Community Initiatives' Helping Hand Fund provides one off financial support to households in Lairg Community Council area who are struggling financially.

Grants of up to £250 are available to households who need help to pay an energy bill, or purchase an energy efficient white good - or provide assistance towards the costs of heating system repairs.

#### What can be Funded?

- Grants of up to £250 will be awarded to households towards heating/energy costs. Electric, Oil, LPG Gas, Calor Gas Bottles, Coal, Wood, and other fuel types will also be considered.
- White goods with a minimum energy efficiency A rating can also be funded up to the cost of £250. The Helping Hand Fund will supply replacements for broken appliances or old appliances with an energy efficiency rating of B or below.

To be eligible for a grant applicants must live in the Lairg and District Community Council area and should be in receipt of a benefit. (E.g. Universal Credit, Pension Credit, etc.)

Unfortunately, applicants with savings of over £2500 are not eligible.

All applications are treated with the strictest confidence, however, we may ask for your permission to pass on your details to our partners at the East & Central Sutherland Citizens Advice Bureau for further support.


# Lairg Remembrance Sunday Service






