

Talk of the Town

We've hosted a wonderful array of classes over the last month, all of which were thoroughly enjoyed by everyone who came along.

A particular highlight was our recent talk, 'Introduction to the Geology of

Sutherland,' delivered by former headteacher and keen geology enthusiast, Peter Lang. This event was part of our 'Mountains to Coast' project, generously funded by The National Lottery. Peter's presentation was fascinating, offering a deep dive into the unique geological features of our

region and sparking some discussions among attendees afterwards.

Due to popular demand, Peter will be repeating this talk early in the New Year for us.

But that's not all Peter has in store!

As an ancestor of a crew member from the HMS Jervis Bay, a vessel that sank in the 1940s during an act of extreme bravery in the North Atlantic, he has an equally compelling talk lined up on this maritime history involving local service men from Caithness & Sutherland.



Lairg, Sunday, November 9th – The spirit of remembrance shone brightly in Lairg as a gathering of the young and old came together at the Lairg War Memorial for a moving Remembrance Sunday Service.

Led by Sandy Sutherland of the Lairg Christian Fellowship, the ceremony featured traditional bagpipes and powerful readings, ensuring the fallen were remembered with dignity.



During November, we took the time to honour the eleven men, named on Lairg War Memorial, who gave their lives during the Second World War.

CPL. D. J. MACMILLAN, SCOTS GUARDS DOUGALD MACMILLAN 1916 – 1944

Dougald John MacMillan was the son of Alexander MacMillan and his wife Margaret Mackay and was born on 10 February 1916 at Tullochard, Lochside, Lairg. He worked with his father, a mason contractor, before joining the Metropolitan Police.

Dougald served with the Scots Guards. He was invalided out of the army and died in Inverness on 25 April 1944 aged 28 years. By this time his parents were living in Inverness where his Father was a clerk of works.



PTE. A. GRANT, SEAFORTH HIGHLANDERS
SANDY GRANT
1920 - 1944

Sandy was the son of George and Margaret Grant and was born on 09 June 1920 at Rhemarstaig, Lairg.

Sandy served with the Intelligence Section, 5th (Caithness and Sutherland) Battalion Seaforth Highlanders and died on Friday 18 August 1944 aged 24 years.

He is Remembered with Honour at Banneville-La-Campagne War Cemetery, near Caen, Normandy, France.

It was a musical adventure around the world for Primary 3 & 4 pupils.




