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
Page 4 – Book Review

Sausage Casserole

Serves 4

8 Sausages £1.50

1 Onion £0.16p (Chopped)

1 Tin carrots £0.55

Handful of frozen peas £0.20

Gravy £0.60

Salt and pepper to taste.

Total cost: £3.01

- Fry sausages (enough to colour)
- Lightly fry onions with the sausages.
- Transfer into an oven proof dish. Add carrots and peas.
- Make 1 pint of gravy as per instructions on the packet and pour over the sausages.
- Cook in the oven at 180/fan160/gas4. For approx. 1 hour.

Page 4 Book Review - 'The Stranger'

The Stranger by Harlan Coben

The Stranger has recently been made into a Netflix drama, starring Richard Armitage, Jennifer Saunders, Paul Kaye and Dervla Kirwan, but I read the book before the hype began. I loved the fast paced story, which had enough twists and turns to keep me entertained. I can see why it would make a good TV show as I struggled to put the book down!

Our hero is Adam, a New Jersey lawyer who has been happily married for 18 years and has two sons. He is living the American dream until a stranger approaches him in a bar and reveals a devastating secret about his wife. The stranger tells him where to look for the evidence, to back up the unlikely claim, and Adam is shocked at what he finds. When he eventually confronts his wife, she asks to meet in a restaurant but doesn't turn up. When she texts, she asks for space and then disappears, leaving him to pick up the pieces. Knowing the police won't help him, he starts his own search for his wife and it soon becomes apparent that he really doesn't know his wife at all.

'The Stranger' is busy though, visiting more victims and turning their lives upside down as a variety of secrets are exposed. Adam is relentless though, travelling a dangerous path to find out who the stranger is and why these secrets are being revealed.

The plot involves murder, blackmail, stolen money, corrupt police and so much more, culminating in the clever merging of the different storylines at the finale. There were some good twists and I loved the premise of 'The Stranger' turning up, out of the blue, revealing secrets about loved ones. Some might argue that the plot is a bit implausible, but the story was so fast-paced that I was completely immersed in the action and desperate to know what was going on. It was a real page-turner, with an ending that I didn't guess which made it even more enjoyable.

If you like mysteries and suspense thrillers, then I'd recommend trying a Harlan Coben book. With over 60 million books in print worldwide, and his last seven consecutive novels topping the New York Times bestseller list, he must be doing something right. I'm off now to find another one to read!



The Wee Hoose - also known as Broons
Hoose - was featured on an episode of
Grand Tours of Scotland's Lochs. The episode
begins with Paul Morton telling a story about
the 'Wee Hoose'. Viewers were told that it
was built on Loch Shin near Lairg in 1824 by
Jock Broon who was gifted land by a local
laird in return for being taught how to distil
whisky. Paul Morton explains that Broon built
the 'wee hoose' to mark his new status as a

landowner but died shortly afterwards when he shot himself in the foot while out hunting. However, as locals know, Broons Hoose was built only 20 years ago as a float for the Lairg Gala. The tale is well recorded in the village with an interpretation board at the lochside detailing the life story of Jock. Whatever the story of Broons Hoose, it remains a much treasured feature in Lairg.
