The Lord is near to all who call on him, to all who call on him in truth. He fulfils the desire of all who fear him; he also hears their cry, and saves them.

Friday 1st

'I delight greatly in the Lord; my soul rejoices in my God. For He has clothed me with garments of salvation and arrayed me in a robe of His righteousness.' Isaiah 61 verse 10 NIV. Saturday 2nd

Sunday 3rd

Bless, protect and support him, especially at this time as he addresses the burden of health issues, both personally and within his wider family. Grant him long to reign over us, and bestow upon him the gifts of wisdom and discernment as together we face the opportunities and challenges of our times.

Monday 4th

A regular contributor received a phone call at a time when they were busy. They said they would ring back the following day. However the reason for the call was to pass on the sad news of the death of a close relative of the caller. God's Holy Spirit intervened and instead of ringing the following day they felt they had to get involved now. Our contributor prayed for the whole family at some length and the bereaved person felt greatly helped. Loving God, thank you that You guide each one of us and work through us to bring Your blessing and help.

Tuesday 5th

Today is SQA result day. Loving God we bring before you all the people in our parish and beyond who will find out today how they did in their certificate exams. We rejoice with those who achieved what they hoped for. For pupils who are disappointed today please help and encourage them to find other routes to achieve their life goals.

Wednesday 6th

It is likely that each one of us will know someone who is not very well at the moment. Other people are perhaps suffering and awaiting a diagnosis. Healing God, we pray for all who are involved, asking for Your compassion and healing power.

Thursday 7th

Continuing from July and for the duration of August, Rob Easton-Berry will present a Christian development course on Thursday mornings at 10.00 am in Canisbay Church Hall. This consists of a short film, study of Paul's letter to the Philippians and discussion where participants can share questions and personal experiences. Refreshments will be served. Loving God, bless Rob and Janet and each of the attendees who find Christian growth from participating in courses like this.

Friday 8th

The following words were written anonymously: 'An early-morning walk, jog or run with a dog at your side is a blessing for the whole day'. 4 Paws says to enjoy the heat, but remember your pets and don't let them overheat, so walks early in the day are a good idea. Father God, help us to be mindful of our pets at all times but especially when the weather is warm. We give thanks for all the joy animals can bring to us.

Saturday 9th

A few pounds to some may not seem a lot of money but to those in need it can provide more than we can realise. Poverty is not something we choose - it chooses us. Lord, teach us to be aware of those around us who struggle with money and the cost of living. Teach us not to judge others less fortunate than ourselves and to find discreet ways of helping those truly in need.

Sunday 10th

Heavenly Father, we pray for families and for governments caught up in blame and recriminations over what was handed on to them, or what they are watching other relatives or nations do. Awaken Your Spirit in the hearts of those whose behaviour wreaks destruction and sends progress backwards. Embolden their closest confidentes not to collude with bitterness or bullying, but to be role models of compassion and humility.

Monday 11th

Compassionate God, we pray for those struggling with age-old problems of poverty, isolation, and fear. In particular, we pray for all who know the pangs of hunger, who fear for what tomorrow will bring, who go without to help others. We pray for those who staff, support and use food banks and charities which attempt to alleviate poverty. Help us to remember that even on His most difficult days, Jesus gave all He had to nourish others. Give us the boldness to follow His example in whatever way we can.

Tuesday 12th

The 23rd, later this month, marks the *International Day for the Remembrance* of the Slave Trade and its Abolition. The hymn writer John Newton (who wrote Amazing Grace) was the captain of a slave ship in his younger days. In later life Newton supported William Wilberforce in his pursuit of the abolition of slavery. Heavenly Father, sadly 'modern slavery' remains prevalent today, with 'people trafficking' one of the areas of international crime that exist in the UK. We pray for the victims of this crime and the law enforcement agencies that are tasked with dealing with it.

Wednesday 13th

Morven Day Services in Kilmarnock provide a service for adults, offering mental health support in East Ayrshire, through Crossreach. Loving God, where there is stigma and isolation through mental health issues, may people find company and support, and may they feel known, cared for and listened to without agenda or expectation.

Thursday 14th

The following quote is from Lou Holtz - "Ability is what you're capable of doing. Motivation determines what you do. Attitude determines how well you do it." Abraham Lincoln said "I never had a policy; I have just tried to do my very best each and every day". Heavenly Father we look to You to help us to also operate in this way. By just putting a little more effort into something it could make such a difference to the end product.

Friday 15th

Update on July 2nd entry. The rescued hedgehog is continuing to improve with medication provided by the NSPCA. Hopefully she will soon be returned to her Caithness habitat. Living God who sees the sparrow fall, thank you that Your heavenly love extends to all whom You have made, including each one of us.

Saturday 16th

Caring God, we hold up people who are agonising over the difficulties of succession - passing on a family farm, a business, looking for new leaders, hoping for work to continue and reputations to be upheld, or for the end of an era to be positive even if it is painful. We ask for Your wisdom and Your courage to be with those handing on their life's work and those newly inheriting, whether gladly or with trepidation.

Sunday 17th

Today the Sacrament of Baptism will be celebrated in Dunnet Church. Heavenly Father, may this baby know Your love and in the years to come serve You faithfully. We ask that its parents will be guided by You and gain strength from You. Please help the church family here in Pentland Parish to look out for and care for them.
