Sunday 1st

Today is the first Sunday of Advent and it gives us the opportunity to centre our thoughts on Hope. Heavenly Father we ask for Your hope to arise in our hearts. It is from You alone that our hope comes. Help us to be free of the anxiety, discouragement and distractions that have been around us this year. We ask that You will be glorified in this season of expectation.

Monday 2nd

In John O'Groats there is a Community Fire Station. Loving Lord, please protect our fire fighters when they are called out on duty. We ask that they will know strength and courage from You. We also remember their loved ones at home worrying about them when they tackle fires.

Sunday 8th

They couldn't stop admiring all the colourful birds and scenery. Thank you dear Lord for providing us with such a beautiful world. We pray that You guide us to take good care of it.

Monday 9th

Take my yoke and put it on you and learn from me because I am gentle and humble in spirit and you will find rest. For the yoke I will give you is easy and the load I will put on you is light'. Tuesday 10th

We also pray for all those who will have to work on Christmas Day to make our lives safer and more comfortable.

Wednesday 18th Prayer Time at Canisbay Church Hall at 2.00 pm

Over the Festive Period, especially in cities and big towns there will be people sleeping in doorways. Caring God, bless all the people who through voluntary work will be on the streets over Christmas showing compassion to those individuals who, for whatever reason, have been disconnected from their families and friends. We ask that You keep the homeless warm with Your grace, and lead us to be helpful to them in any way we can, just as You have been merciful to us.

Thursday 19th

Lord may we never forget the joyfulness of children as we approach this wonderful season - may their joy spill out onto us and be a compass in our journey towards a future filled with Your everlasting love. In the words of Barbara Bush: 'When all the dust is settled and all the crowds are gone, the things that matter are faith, family and friends.'




