Tuesday 1st

We have a huge problem and pray about it as God invites us to. The problem goes away but very soon after it is back. Although we are invited to bring our problems to Jesus and leave them at his feet we pick them up again. Help us Lord to follow Your guidance and resist temptation.

Thursday 17th

With war in Ukraine, the Middle East, Iran and now the involvement of the USA some people are frightened of the possibility of it breaking out all over Europe. There are many deaths as a result of bombs and drones. Families are being destroyed. The Bible speaks of the end of our world but perhaps some folk think of this as alarmist. Reader what is your opinion? It is urgent that we pray and keep on praying that there will still be a world for our children and grandchildren to grow up in.

Friday 18th

We pray with grateful hearts to thank you for the blessings You've bestowed upon us. Your goodness and mercy have followed us every step of the way. Thank you for the gift of life, love, and relationships. We thank you for the food on our tables, the roofs over our heads, and the opportunities that lie before us. Help us to remember that every good gift comes from You.
