#### Sunday 1st

Heavenly Father, we look forward to the time when the whole world will be as one in concern for the weakest and poorest, for the very old and the very young. Encourage, we pray, the various communities of faith to unite in sharing their beliefs and work for common goals, and neighbourhood groups to get together to care for those most vulnerable and at risk. We humbly ask that we might play a part in this task, perhaps sharing a contact, enabling a discussion, or supporting a work project. May we dwell together in peace, making the wholeness of others at the heart of our concern. May we each grow into harmony, truthful to self, faithful to others and in balance with nature.

#### Monday 2nd

Loving Lord, we pray for encouragement and strength for foster parents. Give them understanding, patience and grace as they open their homes and families to children in need. We also ask that You will guide other families to consider undertaking this very worthwhile commitment.

#### Tuesday 3rd

Today is World Bicycle Day. The aim is to promote physical activity and the use of bicycles for transportation. Cycling regularly is a great way to stay healthy and active. It reduces the risk of stroke and heart disease. Cycling can also provide a space for quiet reflection, allowing people to connect with God and nature, leading to a deeper understanding of their faith. Heavenly Father, encourage those who are able, to use their bicycle more often.

Run by CrossReach, the Elms in Edinburgh is a specialist residential care home for older people suffering from dementia. Loving God we pray for the residents receiving care; may they, their families and friends know peace and comfort. For the staff team: may they be blessed with good health, strength, peace and wisdom. May the residents keep well and live lives filled with meaning.

#### Thursday 5th

During the month of May when there were no services in Keiss and Dunnet we thank all our congregation members who made the effort to travel to another church. We also thank those who helped lead the services in Olrig and Canisbay. Dear Lord, we are told that through You all things are possible and we are grateful to all the people who rose to the challenge of helping out with worship.

#### Friday 6th

Loving Lord, we pray for all the people who are very shy and lack self-confidence and self-esteem. Let them know that their opinion matters as much as one of the more extrovert people. Please help them overcome their shyness so that they don't feel excluded from their circle of friends and acquaintances.

#### Saturday 7th

It seems clear that the new Pope is set to continue the good work of his predecessor, particularly in regard to deep concern for those in our world who suffer from poverty and injustice. Please help him to follow Your guidance. There is much more that Your people have today that unite rather than divide them.

#### Sunday 8th

During the month of May a couple of the services at Olrig were led by a member of the congregation. Along with the praise items that had been selected in advance people in the pews had a chance to request their favourite hymn be sung. Heavenly Father there are many hymns and each one of us will have one they find particularly meaningful. We praise You for the gift of music and the opportunity to share it. Encourage us to sing to Your glory not only in church buildings but in any place and at any time of day.

#### Monday 9th

Today is day one of the *Caithness Music Festival*. Our county has so much talent and people of all ages are willing to compete at this event. Caring God be with the competitors as they go on stage to perform. Some find it a bit daunting, especially if it is their first time competing. Over the coming months we may have visitors to the Sunday Service at each of our four churches. It is always a pleasure to welcome new people into our midst. We extend a special welcome to Simone who is a regular visitor each year. At Canisbay people have the chance to come into the church each day. There is a Prayer Request box in the vestibule. Heavenly Father we ask You to draw near to all those who leave requests in the box and let them know You are with them.

#### Wednesday 18th Prayer Time at Canisbay Church Hall at 2.00 pm

Father God, help us to value life as much as You do, and to be good stewards of the bodies You have crafted for us. Help us to make best use of the time You have given us here on the earth to do Your will and glorify You.
