Friday 1st

Almighty God, it seems to be a very long time since we were urged to pray for the future of our churches and congregations. Months have moved into years and we appear to have no real clarity about what is to happen. We are encouraged to seek God's will in this but it is very hard to keep going. An old hymn says "God can do anything but fail". Dear God, help each of us to believe and to keep praying.

Saturday 2nd

With darker days and colder winds with the possibility of rain and sleet 4 Paws asks everyone to make sure both you and your pets keep warm. Be sensible about food and clothing and if possible both of you should try to take a little toddle out. It will surely help with meeting/thinking/smiling at others and returning home ready to face the day. Father God, we pray for all who feel isolated when living alone. Encourage them to try to get a little breath of fresh air. However there are people who can't get out. Remind those of us who are fit to slot in a visit or phone call to those who are housebound.

Sunday 3rd

If you don't already have one you may wish to get a Poppy in the next few days. Lady Haig's Poppy Factory in Edinburgh has been making poppies and supporting veterans since its founding nearly 100 years ago. The poppy denotes peace, sorrow and the interconnectedness of all living things. Heavenly Father we bring before You all who work in the Poppy Factory. May these workers feel proud of what they do to keep alive the memory of all who died in battle.

Monday 4th

On 22 September *Sunday Worship* on Radio 4 explored the word '*liminality*' with its listeners. It is a fascinating word and worth further exploration for those interested in linguistics. In short it relates to the time when we are removed from our normal duties at work or in the home. It is the time when we are in transit such as commuting or out walking; it is the time in our life when we lose our daily identity as an employer, employee or a parent. Lord I pray that You help me to be aware of the liminal spaces in my life so these voids are filled with giving You thanks and praise but more importantly, it gives me the time to hear what You are saying to me and how I may serve You better with the skills and talents You have so graciously given me.

Tuesday 5th

We ask that people will be able to afford to heat their homes, and where this is challenging, may they attend Day Centres where food and warmth are provided. This time of year also brings difficult driving conditions. Please keep people safe as they travel.

Today is the last opportunity for Blythswood boxes to be dropped off at Castletown and Community Free Church. Tomorrow they will be collected and taken to the Blythswood depot at Evanton. Due to your generosity, people of all ages will be delighted with the boxes they receive. Thanks also for monetary donations towards transport costs. Caring God, we bring before You all who will receive a box and ask that You draw near to them. Bless also those who donated goods for the boxes.

Thursday 7th

There are times when every human needs a listening ear, an outstretched paw and a loving heart. Pets of any kind can really enhance the lives of their owners. Creator God, You are the maker of all living things. You called forth the fish in the sea, the birds in the air and animals on the land. We ask that you will bless our pets.

Friday 8th

"Blessed are those who mourn for they will be comforted" Matthew, chapter 5 verse 4. Loving God, it seems that so many of our friends and relatives have suffered loss during the year. We pray for all the families involved and we give thanks that You have heard our continued prayers for each of them. On our local level, thank you for using Janet, Linda, Heather, David and others who bring comfort and healing to the bereaved. Saturday 9th

Caring God as we approach Remembrance Sunday we pray for all members and former members of the armed forces who are still suffering, both physically and mentally, from injuries and experiences which were incurred while serving their country. Please encourage people to attend church and war memorial services in our parishes and further afield, tomorrow. Sunday 10th

Almighty and everlasting God we give You thanks for the memory and good example of those who have laid down their lives in the service of their country. We remember their courage and devotion even unto death. Accept their sacrifice we ask, let it not be in vain that they have died in the cause of righteousness and honour. In Your mercy we ask that You will send Your peace into the hearts of all men and women.

Monday 11th

This month we pray for the work done by *CrossReach* at Cunningham House in Edinburgh. Loving God, You know all the men and women who are experiencing homelessness in Edinburgh. We pray for all the work that is done in this supported hostel accommodation at Cunningham House. We ask You to shower Your love and grace upon those who are supported by the service. May they be given confidence and reassurance through their journey.

Saturday 16th

John O'Groats Playpark Development have a few things organised for November. Today there will be both Christmas Lantern making and family bingo. On the 27th they have a swap shop planned. Loving God, You know the pleasure young children get from time spent at a playpark. We give thanks for the effort put into staging fund raising events by the Playpark committee, to bring new play facilities to our area.

Sunday 17th

"God blesses those people who make peace. They will be called his children!" Matthew chapter 5 verse 9. Loving Father, hear our prayers when we pray for all the inhabitants of countries still at war. May their political leaders be wise enough to negotiate a long lasting peace with their neighbours. We should not feel privileged to live in a peaceful country, it should be the lot of all human beings.

Monday 18th


