Friday 1st

Loving God, thank You for so graciously answering our prayers for the Royal Service last month. What a joy and privilege it was to worship with our gracious King, our Church Family, and with new and old friends. Every aspect of the day was richly blessed and it has been a source of joy to share with some friends who were unable to be with us.

Saturday 2nd

Traditionally this is the month when students begin further education. Many young people leave their home in Caithness and travel south to study. Gracious God we ask You keep them in your care and help them to have a good work/recreation balance as they take the first steps to their chosen career.

Sunday 3rd

Father, we pray for all those affected by the wild fires that are causing so much damage. Please protect Your people and Your animals. We pray for rain to fall to extinguish the fires. Please send help to those in need.

Monday 4th

We pray that the September weather conditions will be favourable for the farmers so that all their crops may be safely gathered in. For people who have small holdings it can be frustrating to have to wait their turn for the harvesting contractor to come to them, when the crop is ready and the weather good.

Tuesday 5th

Tonight Caithness Presbytery meets for the first time since the summer break. It had been hoped that a vote would take place on the new proposed Mission Plan, however the vote has been postponed as the Presbytery Planning Committee is still in the process of meeting with all the Kirk sessions.

Heavenly Father we come before You seeking Your will as Presbytery seeks support for the new proposed Mission Plan. Developing the way forward has been a long and challenging process with passionately held views. Your will be done, and we ask that Your guidance and wisdom is bestowed upon all involved, both with those who have to make final decisions about the future of our churches and with the members of our congregations such that the outcome of the rescheduled vote can be accepted graciously and the revised plan implemented successfully.

Wednesday 6th Prayer Time 2.00 pm at the home of Rev Esme Duncan Mission Aviation Fellowship is a Christian Mission organisation that uses light aircraft to overcome barriers of isolation such as jungles, mountains, swamps, and dilapidated infrastructure in some of the world's remotest places. The pilots and personnel deliver doctors, pastors, school books, medicines, in fact anything that can be safely and speedily transported by air. Father God we pray that this can continue to happen and more people benefit from the service.

Thursday 7th

We are very fortunate to have volunteers who cut the grass around our church buildings and clean the churches. This preserves and enhances the appearance of the grounds and church interiors. Loving Father we ask Your blessing on each one of them as they give up their time and share their talents to do these tasks.

Friday 8th

October will see our friends at Castletown and Community Free Church coordinating the Blythswood Shoe Box Appeal. Each year people very generously donate items to this. There is no obligation to fill a box, even a few items will be gratefully received. A leaflet will be available in each of the four churches in our parish should you be unsure of what is suitable to be included in the box. Perhaps you can consider buying an item or two when you are shopping over the next few weeks.

Loving Lord we pray that each person receiving a box will know Your love and get much joy from the contents of the box.

Saturday 9th

We remember Church Family members who used to sit beside us in the pews and enjoy fellowship with us after the services but who are no longer able to come to church. Loving God please be with them in the care home or their own homes. We still think of them and ask You will surround them with Your arms of love and healing.

Sunday 10th

Lord, please renew our spirits and cleanse our hearts. Renew our minds and transform our lives - may all we do, be what Jesus would do.

Monday 11th

Loving God, thank You for friends! The weeks of summer have given most of us the precious opportunity to spend time with friends and we have been richly blessed. September brings us the reminder that things are back to normal but many of us have precious photos on our phones to help us re-live happy experiences. Hopefully we shall remember promises made to pray for our friends. God never has too many people in His inbox and He will answer far beyond our asking.

Tuesday 12th

Heavenly Father we pray for all those who struggle with addiction. We hear more every day about the devastation caused to families and loved ones through this dreadful problem. Be with those whose lives are ruined by the increasing use of banned substances and with Your help, may they find the strength to turn their lives around.

Wednesday 13th Prayer Time - 2 pm in Canisbay Church Hall "They won't follow a stranger: they will run from him because they don't know his voice." John 10 verse 5 (NLT). In Ibby MacIver's book Gleanings of a Shepherd's Wife she talks of sheep recognising the farmer's voice. She then asks the question is she herself close enough to the Good Shepherd to recognise His voice when He calls to her. She knows He wants to supply her needs and feed her - with spiritual food. Thursday 14th

Sunday 17th

Monday 18th

Four Paws has something slightly different for us this month.
