### [The Priory Inn](#)

Offering a full range of restaurant food and local ales, the Priory has been a popular venue since 1822. Open 12pm until 10pm you will always find a warm welcome in very pleasant surroundings. In warmer months there is ample outside seating for eating or for simple lubrication. Tables can be booked and there are regular “themed” evenings which are very popular.



### [Oakham Treasures](#)

If History and memorabilia is your thing then a visit to Oakham Treasures is a must. One of the largest collections of retail and farming memorabilia is available at Oakham Farm. Acorns Café also offers the chance for refreshment. Open Tuesday-Saturday 10.00am to 5.00pm. You will have a fantastic trip down memory lane; a revisit is a must, there is so much to take in.



### [Priors Wood Nature Reserve](#)

We are SO LUCKY to have Priors' Wood on our doorstep. Stretching from the Lodge at Caswell Lane up to Charlton Farm and the Downs School this ancient woodland is owned and managed by Avon Wildlife Trust. Many paths criss-cross through undulating valleys. In spring there is a magnificent display of Bluebells. You can also use the paths to link up with a variety of longer walks through the Gordano Valley.



### [Parish Wharf Nature Reserve](#)

Stretching over 113 Acres this reserve at the outskirts of Portbury Parish was created to provide a green corridor between the Severn Estuary and the lush, green Gordano Valley. Amateurs and enthusiasts alike can enjoy a

network of footpaths and hides. The Friends Group work hard to nurture and preserve this rich environment. New members are always welcome.
