Parish Council News

This year has seen the Parish Council working on several projects, including maintenance of both play-parks and installation of our Speed Monitoring Sign (more below). The Parish Council has also discussed and fed into the wider debate on changes to the A369, local planning and issues around fly tipping and litter. We have also provided a recycling bin for medicine blister packs (which cannot be recycled in "normal" recycling boxes — this is situated in the Village Hall Reading Room and available for all members of the village community to use.

As ever, any member of the village community is welcome to attend Parish Council meetings – usually held on the Tuesday of the first full week of a month, 8pm at the Village Hall. We have vacancies for councillors too!

Flooding and Heavy Rain

Yet again, we had a deluge in the village recently and it was fantastic to see so many members of the community coming out to help clear drains and sweep water. Please remember to keep yourself safe with hivisibility clothing and not endangering yourselves in the road. Likewise, please drive <u>carefully</u> in flood water.

Sadly, it seems we are going to face storms like this with increasing regularity so need to ensure that we keep the village prepared for when it happens: please check the drains and gulleys around your property to ensure they are not clogged with soil and leaves. If you are able to clear them yourself, please do. If you require help, please contact the Parish Council or message the Village Facebook page. Keeping these clear helps everyone!

Speed Camera and Traffic in the village

Since February 2025, we've been regularly monitoring traffic speeds and volumes at three points around the village (using the new speed sign): Mill Lane, Caswell Lane and High Street. Here's what the latest data tells us:

Traffic volumes and Speeds:

- Around 9,000 cars pass through the village each day (Mill Lane + Caswell Lane).
- Mill Lane has seen a slight reduction in daily traffic, from 9,603 vehicles (Sept 2023) to 7,598 vehicles (Sept 2025).
- Average speeds ranged between 18 22-mph.
- Between 39 72% of drivers kept to the 20-mph speed limit.
- Only 1 6% of drivers exceed 31-mph, but some reach dangerously high speeds.

What this means

Many drivers are traveling within or close to the speed limit, but a small minority are driving at extremely unsafe speeds. This continues to pose a risk for pedestrians and children commuting to school. All findings will be reported to North Somerset Council as part of ongoing efforts to improve village traffic and road safety. Portishead Christmas Lights Switch-On

Portishead will be switching on their Christmas Lights on Monday 24th November. Just a warning for owners of animals that this will include **fireworks at 6.45pm**. The High Street and roads around will be closed from 5pm on the day (with diversions in place) and the ceremonies will include the V-Dubs, Fire Service and Coastguard escorting Santa to switch on the lights. Also, organisations from the village, including the WI, Village Hall, Parish Council and our newest local business - Port Velo bike workshop – will be there so you can find out more about what is on offer.

Portbury Village Hall and Social Club

It has been another great year at the Village Hall. We have hosted private parties (from family events and children's parties – even one with a bouncy castle – up to large scale "significant" birthdays!) and weddings, Quiz nights and the ever-popular Rock n Roll Bingo. There are also groups using the hall regularly, including Martial Arts and Mindfulness workshops.

A great new favourite has been the new Cheese and Wine evenings – we visited the world of Italian wine and cheese recently, where will be next?

Over the course of the year, the whole Hall has been redecorated and a new bar fitted in the Main Hall – the spaces are all lovely and welcoming so, if you haven't seen us for a while, we recommend dropping in to check us out!

We have invested in a TNT Sports subscription, meaning that we can show **Prem Rugby**, **Champions League** and **Premiership Football**. We are showing all of the Bristol Bears and England Rugby matches and can show other games on request. We will also be showing the **Men's Six Nations** tournament in February 2026. We have a film licence and are offering Film Nights next year: films cannot be advertised online but will be on posters in the Village Hall and on our Film Club WhatsApp (coming soon) — if you would like to see particular films on our huge new screen, let us know!

On top of all of that, we are still confident that we offer the best value bar in the area: from £3.50 for Gem, Thatcher's, Carlsberg, Guinness... we also have a great range of wines, spirits and non-alcoholic options.

Introducing Port Velo Cycle Works to the Portbury Community.

We'd like to say a big thank you to everyone in Portbury for the warm welcome since we opened our doors. Port Velo Cycle Works is new to the village, but from day one it's been clear that this is a place with a strong sense of community – something we're proud to be joining.

Our workshop exists to keep people riding safely and confidently, whether that's commuting, exploring the lanes, or heading out on weekend adventures. We'll be running basic bike maintenance workshops for residents, supporting local cycling groups, and helping encourage safe cycling routes for families and new riders. We're also keen to build links with local schools and youth groups to promote cyclling as a healthy, accessible and enjoyable part of village life.

Alongside the workshop, we're opening our doors as a small drop-in spot for cyclists, walkers and anyone passing by. We'll be serving coffee and cake – nothing fancy, nothing commercial, just a friendly space for people to stop, chat and feel welcome.

Our aim is simple: to be a useful part of the village, support the local community, and create a place where everyone feels comfortable popping in, even if it's just for a bit of company or a question about their bike.


