#### **Parish News**

**Portbury Parish Council** has been busy this year, with meetings taking place concerning flooding, traffic, planning and other issues affecting the village. **Drains and footpaths** – at this time of year, it is really important to take time to check the drains and footpaths around your home, if you are able, and those of your neighbours if they need a little help. The help of some fantastic local heroes ensured that recent rains didn't result in flooding but we all need to keep an eye out for future issues, including clearing leaves and overhanging branches from our trees.

**Parish Council meetings and vacancies**: Everyone is welcome to attend meetings (1<sup>st</sup> Tuesday of the month in the Village Hall). Agendas are published one week before meetings and **only agenda items** can be discussed. Any member of the community may add items to the agenda prior to publication. #### Christmas Tree-Cycling

North Somerset 'Tree-Cycling' will be taking place again this year. Each year, thousands of Christmas trees are repurposed, raising £120,000 for local charities; recycling and repurposing 15,000 trees and saving over 200 tonnes of carbon emissions.

In January, you can choose to recycle your tree at:

**Noah's Ark Zoo Farm** – accepting trees between Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> and Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> January – leave your tree at the collection point in the main car park between 10.30am and 4.00pm.

**St Peter's Hospice** – collecting trees from selected postcodes – tree collection must be prebooked online at www.stpetershospice.org/treecollection .

All trees must have decorations and the pot removed, as some will be used for animal enrichment and the rest will be chipped for land regeneration. Christmas trees can also be taken to the household waste and recycling centres where they can be recycled with garden waste. If you have signed up for garden waste collection, you can put your tree out for collection from Monday 13<sup>th</sup> January 2025.





#### Portbury Village Hall and Social Club

#### Friends of Portbury Wharf Nature Reserve

#### New nature trail at Portbury Wharf Nature Reserve



The Friends of Portbury Wharf have created a unique **Wetlands Trail** to help visitors identify the wildlife that visits the Nature Reserve and Salt Marsh.

It isn't easy to know what wildlife to look out for. It is especially tricky as many of our creatures migrate and are not around all year. So we have designed this trail with swappable panels to bring you the right information at the right time.

**The winter panels are on display now.** They tell you what is going on in each of the 12 habitats across the reserve, such as the Wet Meadow, the North and South Pools and the Estuary. Then it's all change in April, when wildlife starts nesting and different birds arrive from Africa. So the summer panels will tell you all about these seasonal changes.

**Look out for the What am I? squares too**. Coming soon, these will have clues to help you name the wildlife. They will be fixed to the square sections on the habitat panels and be changed every month or so. Follow us on Facebook or Instagram if you want to know when the displays are changed.



**So come and try out the Wetlands Trail at Portbury Wharf Nature Reserve**. See if you can identify any of our wonderful wetland wildlife, you never know what might turn up. The well-camouflaged birds can be hard to spot so, if you have binoculars, bring them along. But even without, there are bigger and more conspicuous creatures to look for, such as the white Little Egret, Grey Heron and Roe Deer. Then there are the things that don't fly or run away. Look out for teasels covered in winter frosts, spiders' webs sparkling with dewdrops and glossy, red winter rosehips. There is always something of wonder.

We hope this nature trail will be enjoyed by visitors of all ages and serve as an educational resource for schools, youth clubs and other visiting groups.

Thanks to the National Grid Community Fund for awarding us a grant to create this Wetlands Trail. Thanks also to the owners of the reserve, North Somerset Council, for their support throughout the project.

#### St Mary's Primary School

## St Mary's pupils display outstanding behaviour and attitudes

Following an inspection in October 2024 Ofsted has graded St Mary's CofE Primary School in Portbury as Outstanding for Behaviour and Attitudes and Good in the other four inspection areas.

The inspection was conducted under the new Ofsted framework in which single word judgements for overall effectiveness are no longer awarded. Inspectors commented that "pupils love coming to school. Teachers expect pupils to achieve well in their lessons and relationships between staff and pupils are strong".

They also noted the children "display exceptional manners around school and ensure that everyone is listened to" and enjoy an "ambitious curriculum".

Headteacher, Miss Amy Townsend, was overjoyed with the report's findings "I am so proud of our school and the high aspirations that we have as a team for the children. It is wonderful to see that the inspectors recognised what a happy place St Mary's is and have celebrated the strong relationships that we have built as a school community and beyond."

Following the publication of Ofsted's report, Dr Gary Lewis, Chief Executive of Lighthouse Schools Partnership (LSP) said, "This report reflects the hard work and dedication of all the staff at the school to ensure a safe, friendly and inspiring learning environment for the children. The inspection highlights the school's strengths and I am pleased that the partnership between the school and trust is recognised to be working well to ensure support and development for both our pupils and our staff."
