On a good note this year we have 3 new teams joining us namely The Greyhound Llantrisant, The Crown Varteg, and Greenlawn are putting in a 3rd team. Welcome to all of you.

The competition will take place again this season and I would encourage anybody who feels nervous about joining in to do it as it is a fun day. We are home this year and we are open to a club that would like to volunteer to host it.

We finished the season with our annual presentation evening which again, because of our high numbers, took place in Ponthir Hall. Again, I think that the hog roast was a big success and with a live duo at an all-in cost of £12 pp made it excellent value. Thanks to all who came and maintained our good turnout of over 100 persons for this event.
