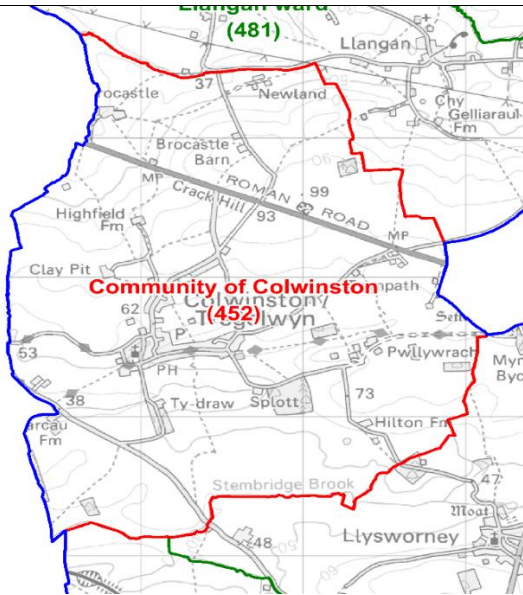
Colwinston is one of three villages in Wales known as a thankful village as it suffered no casualties during the 1st World War

<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Activities &</u></p> <p>There is an ongoing discussion concerning the adoption of The Vines and Heol Cae Pwll by the Vale and whilst there has been some progress, we still await the Vale to accept these roads for maintenance.</p> <p>The Council is in discussion with HM Land Registry to obtain formal title over parcels of land in the village which were part of the Parish but the documentation has been lost. It should be noted that nearly 40 years of Community Council records are missing and we believe were destroyed.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Projects</u></p> <p>The Old Ford Project</p> <p>During the year the Council completed their grant funded project known locally as the old ford project. The area now has a pond and wild flower area and a ancient woodland that sits along side a restored well and clapper bridge. Unfortunately due to the restrictions of funding the state of the trees in the area has taken more of the money than originally intended.</p>
<p>A Dry Well</p>  <p>During the drought this summer the well water practically disappeared. This allowed the Stone Mason to really study the walls of the well which unfortunately showed several cracks and bowing. To remedy this, struts have been attached to support and protect from collapse. This drop in water level hasn't happened for 50 years but of course if it happens more regularly than a more substantial repair will need to be carried out. As the water has started to rise again the soil has been left on the steps to aid preservation and an extended grill has been added to ensure people are safe as they peer in and to protect the stone slab which has a 1980 date scratched into it.</p>	<p>European fresh water eels</p> <p>As the water level dropped a little surprise emerged at the bottom. Confirmed by the Natural history Museum and London Zoological Society there are several European Fresh Water eels living at the bottom.</p> <p>Considered endangered the Council are committed to protecting their habitat.</p> <p>There are reputedly several found in Loch Ness and the Colwinston Council have called this one Collwellie!</p> 
<p><u>Boundary Commission</u></p> <p>The Vale of Glamorgan are conducting a review of their boundaries, this may result in the merger of smaller Community Councils that have an electorate under 1000 people. Colwinston responded to the</p>	<p><u>Local Development Plan</u></p> <p>The Vale of Glamorgan are currently updating their Local Development plan. This is a plan of how and where future developments will happen in the Vale.</p>

<p>consultation highlighting all the local groups and individualism of the Community and how their merger with other council who are all a fair distance would lose this.</p>	<p>Several sites have been highlighted within Colwinston and the council will continue to respond to consultations on these proposals. We encourage people to keep up to date with these. Additional information can be found on the Vale of Glamorgan Website.</p>
<p><u>Fibre optic broadband and mobile phones.</u> Another frustrating year. Since we first applied to Openreach, over four years ago, to have FOB installed across the Colwinston area the UK and Welsh governments have changed the voucher schemes at least twice. In both cases we completed the application, which required an enormous amount of detail, in time. But the schemes were changed before we passed through the system. We are now waiting on the outcome of various reviews to see what happens next. In the meantime, some properties have been connected to FOB, about 25. We have also talked to a commercial company, Netomnia, but they do not seem interested. New housing estates are easier than a rural village. We did arrange with a company in Cambridge for them to install a mobile phone booster on the new school. We even obtained a transmission licence, but the Vale refused to let us drill holes in the school wall. We are trying to put one on the village hall but at the moment we cannot obtain a grant. The village hall committee are happy for us to drill holes in the hall</p>	
<p><u>Future Plans</u> The Council has spent a lot of money in the past few years on community projects and so needs to be mindful of its budgeting. This means that they have put their precept up for the coming year to assist in completing their aims and having enough money to continue maintaining and helping the community. The most pressing aim of the council is to seek additional funding to complete the maintenance of the woodland to open this up to the public for their enjoyment. The Council also are very proactive in preserving their environment and hope to focus on the listed milestones and post box in the future.</p>	<p>If you wish any further details or have any questions about any aspect of the council then please do contact us.</p> <p>The Council members are often around the village or will be at their meeting every 3rd Monday of the month at the village hall</p>

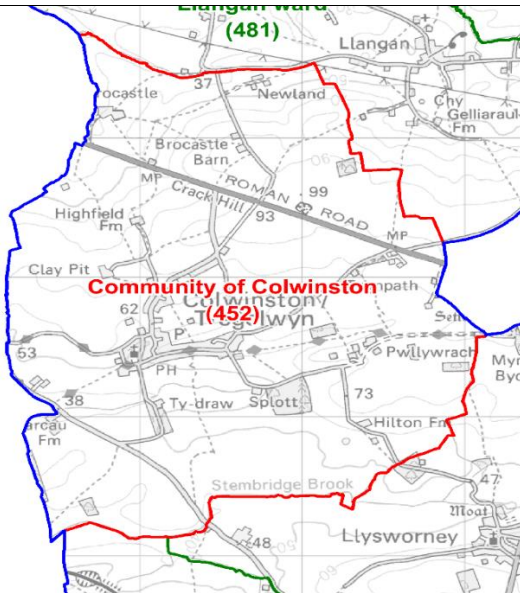

Blwyddyn rwystredig arall. Ers i ni wneud cais i Openreach, dros bedair mlynedd yn ôl, i gael BEff ar draws ardal Tregolwyn, mae Llywodraethau'r DU a Chymru wedi newid y cynllun talebau o leiaf dwywaith. Yn y ddau achos, cwblhawyd y ceisiadau manwl iawn mewn pryd ond newiddiodd y cynlluniau cyn i ni fynd drwy'r system. 'Rydym yn aros am ganlyniadau'r adolygiadau amrywiol i weld beth fydd y cam nesaf. Yn y cyfamser, cysylltwyd tua 25 adailad i'r FfBE. Cafwyd trafodaethau gyda chwmni masnachol Netomnia ond nid ydynt yn mynegi llawer o ddi-ddordeb. Mae stadau tai newydd yn haws i'w cysylltu na phentref gwledig. Trefnwyd, gyda chwmni o Gaergrawnt, i osod bwster ffon symudol ar yr ysgol newydd. Cawsom drwydded i drawsyrry, ond gwrthododd y Cyngor ganiatad i ni wneud tyllau ym muriau'r ysgol. 'Rydym yn ceisio gosod un ar Neuadd y Pentref ond ni allwn, ar hyn o bryd, gael grant. Mae pwyllgor y Neuadd yn hapus i ni wneud tyllau ym muriau'r adeilad.

Bu gwariant y Cyngor ar brosiectau lleol yn sylweddol yn y blynyddoedd diwethaf, ac felly, rhaid bod yn wylidwrus o'r cyllid.
