Council were asked to consider the options with regard to the BT Kiosk in Main Street and they resolved to allow BT to remove the telephone kiosk from North Frodingham. The views from the village, which were quite mixed, were considered at the meeting as were the fact that it had only been used 4 times in a year. Also, potential future contractual issues and funding requirements were discussed and it was felt that potential costs outweighed the benefits.

Also discussed was the village allotment which needs quite a bit of remedial work but this cannot take place until spring for fear of harming the substantial trees that form the boundary. For those of you desperate to know where it is so that you can frantically get in a bid to use it, it is sited opposite the church, the very last plot of land on the left before the bridge. Don't blink!!



The Problem of Plastic Litter

As I cycled down Grange Road today I stopped and picked up a half drunk Coca Cola bottle which a mouse had gnawed at the top to gain access to the sugary liquid.

After the Blue Planet series on the BBC people are now very aware of how damaging plastic discarded into the environment really is, but I wonder how many people think as they throw a half drunk bottle out of the car window onto the verge that in this case it would become brittle due to sunlight, move due to wind and end up in pieces in the roadside drainage ditches on each side of Grange Road.

These ditches both flow West into Towns drain, which in turn flow into Mickley Dike to Hempholme pumping station, where the water and plastic fragments would be pumped up into the higher level of Mickley Dike, which discharges through a pair of clough doors (one way valves) into the River Hull where it winds its way down to Hull where it then passes under the Tidal barrier near the Deep and on into the River Humber which flows out through its estuary into the North Sea where the action of the waves will smash the fragments into damaging micro plastic, creating havoc to fish and other marine life i.e. the Seals at nearby Donner Nook.

Your inbox is probably full of promotional emails promising the most incredible deals. And when this is the norm, it becomes hard to differentiate real bargains from the dodgy ones.

Fake websites and phoney branding can trick even the savviest shopper. But, fortunately, you don't need a computer science degree to spot them. Our eight seasonal tips will help you protect yourself and your family from the majority of these scams.

Stay up to date.

Use strong passwords.

Secure your important accounts with a good password - especially your email.

Once you start shopping, stay alert. Some of the emails or texts you receive about amazing offers may contain links to fake websites, designed to steal your money and personal details. Be wary of links in an email or text message.

When things don't feel right.

Sometimes, things can still go wrong, no matter how careful you are.

After sales care.

After shopping, you should remain on your guard. It's important to be vigilant for any suspicious activity on your bank account.


