

#### **From the Ward Councillors**

#### **CLIMATE CHANGE**

Climate Change & the impact it is having upon our lives now, most noticeably in our area through extreme wet weather conditions is something we should not ignore. (See page 6)

Whilst world leaders meet to discuss what they need to do globally, councillors at ERYC decided in October 2019 to set up our own Climate Change Review Panel. The panel consisted of councillors from each political group and were tasked with examining climate related risks & opportunities to the Council, its residents & businesses & investigated how the Council can act to minimise the risks, considering the impact of climate change, the work that was already underway to reduce carbon emissions & store carbon & the potential for future schemes.

The Review Panel concluded their work in December 2020 and have produced a report with 12 recommendations based on the work they undertook and the evidence that was supplied to them.

The report can be viewed on the council website recommendations include:

- the council to develop a Climate Change Strategy within 12 months
- commits to reviewing procurement procedures
- viability studies into the use of hydrogen as a fuel in some areas

- council explores using land & infrastructure for carbon storage to help offset carbon emissions
- consider investing improving rural transport links in partnership with bus operators & works with all rail companies
- Lobbies government on planning legislation to ensure new developments are fitted with new technology & built to withstand climate change risks

#### **BUDGET**

The Council has set its Budget for 2021-22, in possibly the most uncertain times for local government funding ever. All political groups ended up with similar figures for a proposed Council Tax increase of 3.49%. It has to be noted that Council Tax only makes up part of the councils income and multi million pound savings will still need to be found to balance the books.

#### VACCINATION PROGRAMME

Finally, we are pleased that the vaccination programme is being rolled out so successfully in the East Riding, and we pay tribute to the Councils Public Health team who, under our Director of Public health working with the NHS have worked tirelessly to design and implement the testing and vaccination programmes — often pre-empting Government advice and implementing schemes to get ahead of the game — with great success.

We hope you all stay safe and well, whilst understanding that many will be suffering hardship and loss in the current pandemic.

We have had some cold and wet weather recently which does not encourage us to get out and about so let us look forward to spring and a better future





## From North Frodingham Neighbourhood Watch.

We hope that you all are feeling fine and keeping safe. Unfortunately the scammers

are still feeling well enough to try and steal our hard earned cash off us.

I apologise for this being such a long report, BUT WE ALL MUST BE WARY OF THOSE PEOPLE WHO WISH TO ROB US.

I received these over t'internet. Some actually had my Christian and surname at the top of the letter.

HBSC say that they have some interest pending on my account (even though I don't have an account with them) which I cannot claim unless I contact them.

Her Majesty's Customs and Revenue tell me they have a case which has been set up against me for fraud. If I do not contact them within three days the case will be sent to the Department of Justice.

Also of note; in the Driffield Wolds Weekly, there were items referring to a company called PREMIER TALK that say they supply telephone and broadband services. The Action Fraud squad confirm that this is a scam, (2007 reports in November alone last year).

Also in the paper was a report of a scam from someone saying they are from the Royal Mail Customer Services. A parcel could not be safely left at your address as you were out. Call this number and set a date for a redelivery of the parcel. (Unfortunately this is also what the Royal Mail already do; however in this case the web address is for fraudulent website which request a small down-payment for rearranging the delivery. If this is done by you there will be a telephone call in a few days from someone saying they are from your bank and that there was a suspicious transaction from your account. SO WHAT THEY WANT YOU TO DO IS TRANSFER some money to a safe account number of THEIR choice. This of course will never be seen by you again.

Please remember that the BANKS, POLICE or any other authentic company will NEVER ask you for your PIN or account numbers on any matter.

In a similar vein, I received a text message AND an internet message from a company saying they were DPS. They also couldn't leave a parcel at our address on such and such a date (even though we were in, self-isolating all that week), and that I should pay them £1 to have the parcel delivered again. A few days later the price had gone up to £2.

Stay safe, stay alert and cautious, and keep healthy. And keep a smile on your faces, a smile is, in a nice way, infectious.

### Crime and policing update

### **Local News**

Shop lifting in the Driffield area has seen an increase with a further two local individuals being placed on the Driffield shop watch Scheme and excluded from participating shops for a minimum of 12 months.

Rural surgeries are set to start again in March with the local Community team giving general crime prevention and advice on policing matters.

### **Rural Crime / Operation Galileo**

Patrols continue to visit the remote rural areas across both Driffield Rural and East Wolds and Coastal Wards in order to prevent thefts and criminal damage. Officers will continue to conduct drop-ins to farms and businesses to offer advice on target hardening their assets.

The Rural Taskforce's first week saw a joint night operation with North Yorkshires Taskforce and a positive prevention of a game act offence. Persons were issued Covid fines.

A Police Constable has been assigned to each area. They will lead community engagement, enforcement and develop links and Intelligence for their area. Working together and with Neighbourhood Policing Teams and Patrol teams on wider issues they will be drawing on support from roads policing and Op Galaxy for warrants and pre-planned operations. The Driffield and Bridlington Officer is PC 2310 JONES

Theft of Three Springer Spaniels from Thornholme – The Rural Task Force are dealing with this incident utilising social media. Two dogs have been reunited with owners that were located in the Greater Manchester Police/Lancashire area. There is ongoing work to locate the outstanding dog and deal with the offenders. The social media and publicity use has positively assisted in locating two of the three dogs.

Farm Burglary Burton Fleming - 1 male arrested, vehicle seized, premise searched, CCTV enquires continue.

#### **Operation Galaxy**

Operation Galaxy has focused on proactively tackling crime and those responsible for it with numerous arrests made and illegal goods seized. Please take a look at the news section on our website for frequent full updates and details of arrests made.

Humber Talking is still being undertaken in the Driffield area. We will be adhering to Social distancing guidance and will not be entering houses but speaking to members of the public who want to take part on their doorsteps.
