"The Bridge to Nowhere"

Parish Council

Well, I take it back. In the last Village Voice I mentioned that it would be nigh impossible to get any Parish Council business done online. How wrong I was! Although not all of the councillors have the facilities to engage, we had our first full council meeting on the Zoom platform with only two councillors being unable to join. It went well but was really a trial run for future meetings which cannot yet be held in the Village Hall.

We have several projects to consider in the future and by the time this is published we will have completed remedial tree work at the cemetery. This is part of a rolling three-year project to ensure the area is safe for visitors and insured properly. Our old sit on mower, which is used for both cemeteries, is coming to the end of its life and consideration will be given to replacing at some point. We also have to sadly change our existing website as it is not compliant with modern accessibility standards and cannot cheaply

be made so. A website is mandatory under the Transparency Act as we have to publish all relevant data so that you can see where your money is being spent. We are also hoping to update the current notice boards, which are again necessary to keep you updated as not everyone has a computer. We have made tentative enquiries about tree planting grants but the coronavirus crisis has made other matters slip.

Our next meeting is on Monday 13th July at 7.30pm on Zoom. If anyone wishes access to the Zoom meeting please email me a few days before and I will send you the link. Local Councils are subject to rules that do not permit us to discuss **and** decide unless the item is on our agenda so If you have any issues that you wish to bring to the attention of the Council then please contact me at least a week before the meeting so that consideration can be given to put on the agenda. From our Ward Councillors

We have said so many times over the last weeks how lucky we are to be living in this area. Communities have come together proving how caring and thoughtful people can be and the weather has allowed us to appreciate to its full the beautiful countryside.

Life is gradually beginning to get back into a routine, we are now conducting most of our meetings via video links, as are a number of the parish councils, but a few of us attended County Hall at the end of June for the first Full Council meeting since the lockdown measures were put in place, other councillors joined the meeting via a video link.

Moving into Recovery update

ERYC has paid over £70 million from the government to businesses since the end of March and the councils Business Support Team have spoken to over 650 businesses offering support & advice.

A new package of Discretionary Grants is now being offered by ERYC for those businesses who for whatever reason were unable to claim the first support grants, we hope this will be a lifeline to a great number of our small businesses.

The council is also offering its own grants under Love Your High Street to local businesses which now includes rural locations, the grants are intended to help retail adapt to changes which have occurred as a result of covid.

Non-Essential Business opening

Monday 15th June was the date for all non-essential shops in England to open their doors again, allowing high streets to come back to life.

ERYC have been preparing by consulting businesses & public protection team have visited 1409 businesses to help them become compliant with new regulations. Highway Maintenance have undertaken surveys of our high streets to ensure as many precautions as possible can be introduced to keep shoppers safe which include signing of social distancing. All public toilets were reopened on 15th June to coincide with shops being opened & extra attention to cleaning introduced.

Assessment and support

ERYC Business Support Team are undertaking an impact assessment to determine numbers of businesses in the area who have temporarily closed or will cease trading because of the pandemic.

Health and Wellbeing

The councils Director of Public health and his team have been working 24/7 for the past weeks ensuring guidance is given on safe practices, particularly working closely with all Care Homes in the East Riding to ensure they have supplies of protective equipment as well as the training in their use. Every Care Home has, and is, being contacted daily to ensure supplies and advice are on hand.

Despite the easing of restrictions, our public health experts still warn that a second wave may well occur and the simple basics of keeping distance, and washing hands regularly are still the best precautions.

The East Riding Leisure centres have been offering 'on-line' classes and will start to reopen shortly. However, to keep to government guidelines of social distancing and safe operating practices they will not be able to cater for as many people. For example, it is estimated that East Riding Leisure in Bridlington which can host up to 500 people at one time will only be able to cater for 80.

As we come out of the crisis, it is feared there will be a rise in issues of drug and alcohol mis-use, mental health problems and a clear worry around the health effects on families as unemployment rises.

However, there will be good things come out of the crisis. New ways of working more efficiently, often from home. Large amounts of information and data regarding the elderly and vulnerable to allow the council to target its resources effectively and a lesson learnt that new ways of working that used to take years to implement can be done in weeks!

Crime News and Appeals

Areas within both North Yorkshire and East Riding of Yorkshire have been patrolled following reports of nuisance motor bikes and vehicles linked to rural crime.

One vehicle was stopped in Foxholes after being sighted in the East Riding of Yorkshire area which resulted in the vehicle being recovered for no insurance and the driver reported for Road Traffic Offences.

Another vehicle linked to offences under the Protection of Badgers Act 1992 was stopped in Langtoft, a white transit van was stopped on the A64 after being sighted acting suspiciously within a number of villages within the Wolds and a high risk missing person was located within the RSPB Bempton car park whilst conducting high visibility patrols around the rural villages.

Please report any Wildlife/Rural Crime or ASB issues affecting your community by contacting police on 101 for non-emergency incidents or 999 for suspected crimes in action.

Operation Yellowfin action to tackle motorbike related crime and ASB

Always lock your bike with its fork and ignition locks.

Invest in a secondary quality disc and chain locks.

Secure your bike to a rail, anchor point or anything solid.

Where there are no anchor points lock bikes together with your friends.

Fit a quality approved alarm and tracking system. Invest in an insurance-approved ID and marking system (eg. micro dot, DNA marking, acid etching...)

Park and lock your bike in well lit, busy locations. Try not to leave it in a remote area especially overnight.

Cover your bike. It can hide its value and your security kit as well as protect it from the weather.

Coronavirus Track & Trace Scams Advice

Be aware of a growing trend of criminals taking advantage of the current Covid-19 crisis to defraud innocent people, including the new NHS Test and Trace service.

The NHS Test and Trace service has been introduced to allow the NHS to trace the spread of the virus, isolate new infections and give early warning if the virus is increasing again.

However, scammers are now making phone calls, sending texts and emails pretending to be from NHS Test and Trace

Genuine Contact tracers will never:

- ask you to dial a premium rate number to speak to them (for example, those starting 09 or 087)
- ask you to make any form of payment or purchase a product of any kind

- ask for any details about your bank account
 - ask for your social media identities or login details, or those of your contacts
 - ask you for any passwords or PINs, or ask you to set up any passwords or PINs over the phone
 - disclose any of your personal or medical information to your contacts
 - provide medical advice on the treatment of any potential coronavirus symptoms
 - ask you to download any software to your PC or ask you to hand over control of your PC, smartphone or tablet to anyone else
 - ask you to access any website that does not belong to the government or NHS
- You will only ever be called from the number 0300 013 5000, or you will be texted from “NHS”.
