Proposed changes to local governance

As we draw towards what has been a year none of us expected, we would like to send our sincere wishes to everyone for a very happy & safe Christmas.

We also felt we really needed to make you aware of proposed changes to local government.

Something you need to know

Over recent months ERYC & Hull C.C. have entered into discussions about adopting a Mayoral Combined Authority status between the two authorities.

Hull is one of the countries smallest unitary authorities whilst East Riding of Yorkshire is the 5th largest and the authorities have a widely contrasting political make – up.

What is a Combined Authority and what does it mean?

A combined authority (CA) is a legal body set up using national legislation that enables a group of two or more councils to collaborate and take collective decisions across council boundaries. While established by Parliament, CAs are locally owned and must be initiated and supported by the councils involved.

The government will offer a package of funding for the next 30 years & should the current discussions lead to a Hull, East Riding CA the suggested areas of work are Transport, Skills, Environment & Flood Risk, Infrastructure & Economic Development

The Mayor will be elected and have the power to make decisions about policy and spending in conjunction with the council leaders.

Positives

- In theory working in partnership should produce better outcomes and create collaboration across the 2 authorities in achieving goals
- Government promises to give additional funding called 'gain share' to combined

authorities

- Government states that combined authorities will be ahead in the queue for funding
- Government has expressed its preference for dealing with a single individual i.e. Mayor rather than numerous local authorities.

• Most of the business development sites are in the East Riding

Negatives

- Hull has large areas of deprivation which always attracts the lion's share of funding
- A Mayoral system gives too much power to one person
- Once we agree to combine with Hull there is no going back
- There are fears of a future merging of the authorities and loss of identity
- Is this another layer of government to be funded
- No-one knows what additional powers may be taken from authorities and given to a Mayor in the future
- Most of the business development sites are in the East Riding, will we share our busines rates with Hull?

There are a number of people who believe that with so much change and uncertainty already in place across the country we should not be rushing into making this monumental decision and it would be a very bad move for the East Riding, we would lose our independence and lose to Hull financially.

Others see it as the way forward and we should pool resources and be closer to Hull. The most important issue we believe now is that you deserve to be consulted & can have your say. At present the timetable indicates that the public will be consulted on procedures in July 2021 after the actual decision to combine with Hull has been taken in March 2021

History Group



I would love to report that the history group managed to meet, but just as we thought the village hall could open, the rule of 6 was introduced.

So here I am again reporting no meetings were held, but in our own way we are all part of a major historical event which our descendants will talk about as we do with events like world wars, atomic bombs and President Trump.

There has been some excellent feedback from Anne's article - Ed.

Debbie Butler wrote to say: "Thank you for this. I was particularly interested in the History Group section. I actually worked with Harry Lomas who was named as part of the aircrew who survived the plane crash behind Blue Post. Harry went on to write a book on his experience named "One Wing High.""

I then received this from Shirley Gill:

A few weeks ago my brother and I visited the Blue Post Inn as part of a short trip to remember our uncle, Denis Till, who was in 158 Squadron. We were particularly keen to visit the Blue Post as his plane, the Lili Marlene, had crashed in a field behind the pub during the war. The members of the crew who were walking wounded, including our uncle, were taken in to the pub and given hot sweet tea whilst they waited to be picked up. Imagine our astonishment, in chatting to the gentleman behind the bar, to be handed a copy of the Village Voice, with the article by Anne Mahl regarding this very crash!

I attach a photo of the crew who were in the plane on that night. From back row - L-R Denis Till rear gunner, George Tuohy mid-upper gunner, Dick Munday flight engineer, and Ken Sutton bomb aimer. It was Ken who sadly lost his life in the crash, and he is commemorated on the excellent memorial at Lissett. Front row L-R Les Lamb wireless Last time I mentioned the plane crashing into a field behind the Blue Post during the war, the following photo is of the gap it made in the hedge which has never been filled in. Maurice showed me where it was.
